Our students had celebrated the day by participating in an activity wherein they designed their own postcard to spread the importance of the postal sector in people's and businesses' everyday lives and its contribution to the social and economic development of countries.

Freedom fighters have always inspired and motivated others to fight against injustice. They made people aware of their rights and their power. It is all because of the freedom fighters that we prospered into a free country free from any kind of colonizers. To spread the awareness for the same, CBSE had organized an activity "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" in which students had illustrated beautiful posters on freedom fighters.
