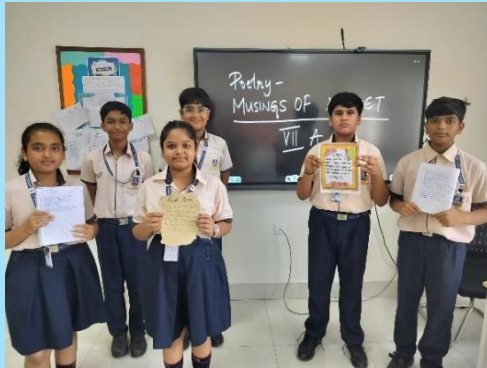
BOOK WEEK CELEBRATIONS

Rakhi for Our Brave Soldiers

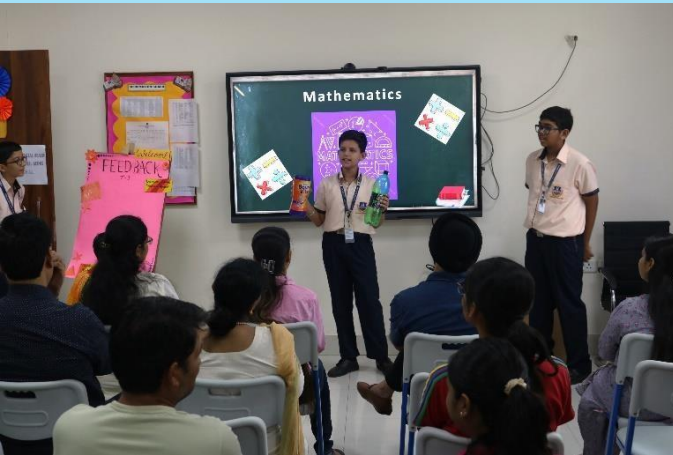

We are bursting with pride at these incredible achievements—living proof that **passion plus perseverance equals success!**



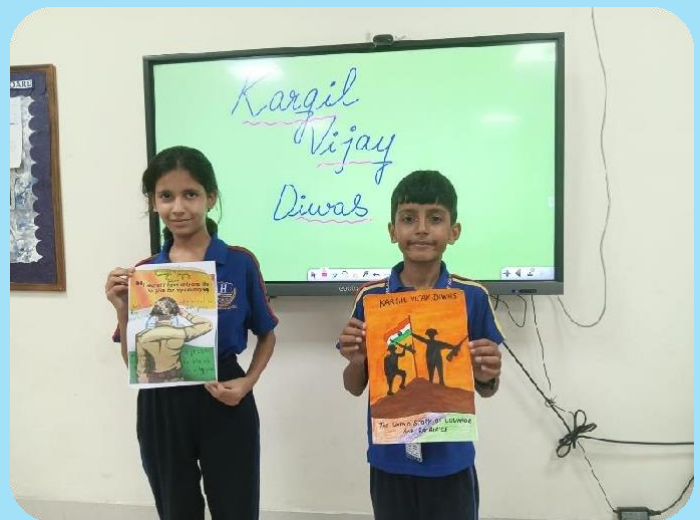
Inspiring Science Session at IIT Delhi

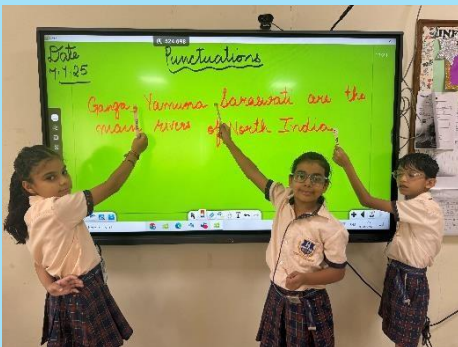

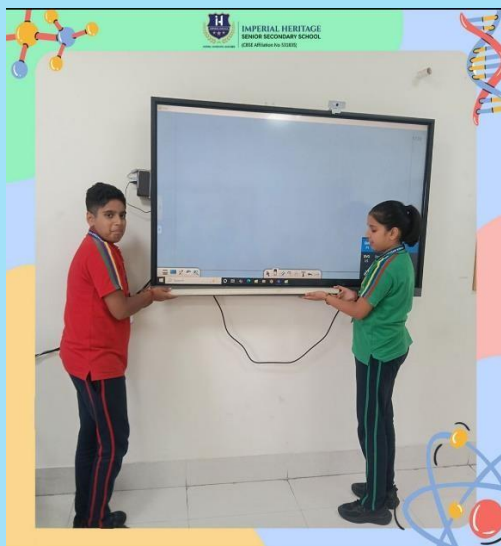
Experiential Learning in Action
