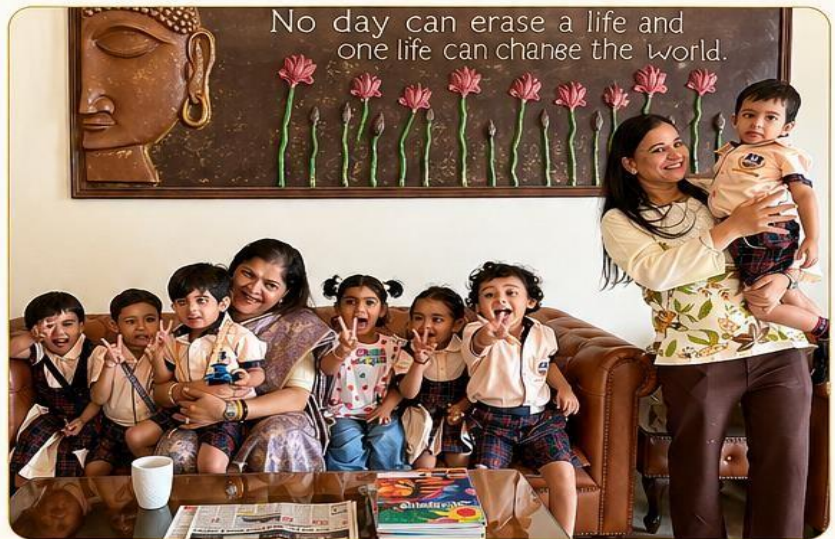
Welcome to the April Edition

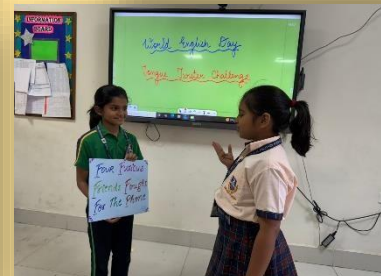
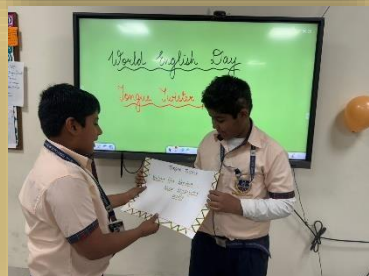
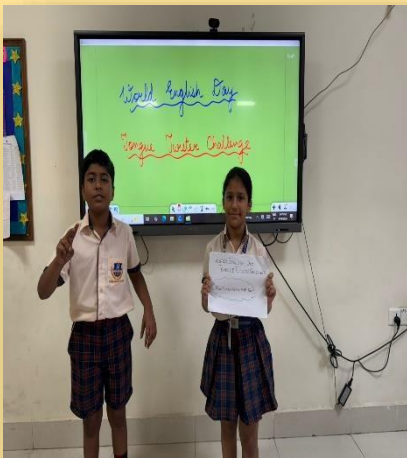


World English Day Celebration
