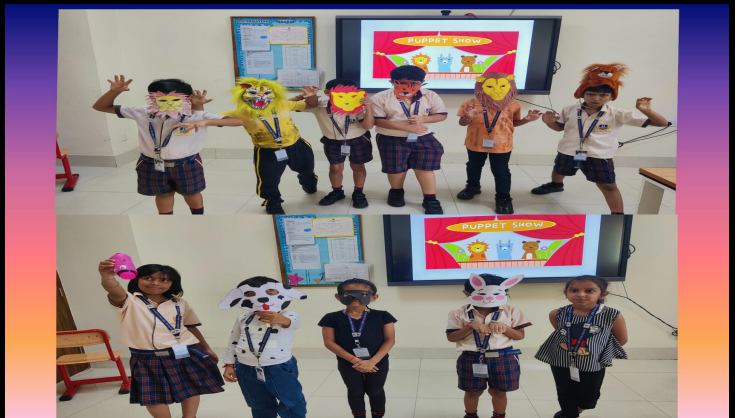
Ira Sangal of II A participated in Ch. Dharam Singh Kamboj Annual Open Skating Tournament and received 1st position.

## 3. General Information
