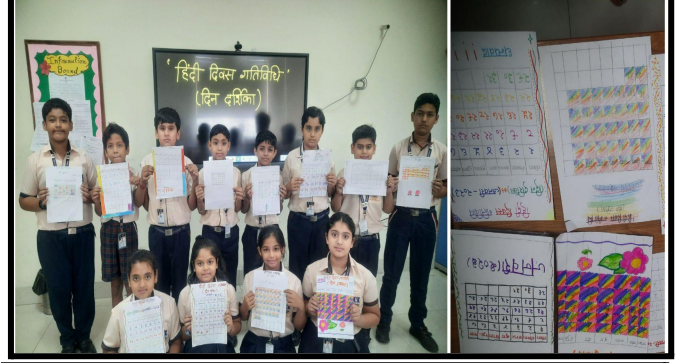
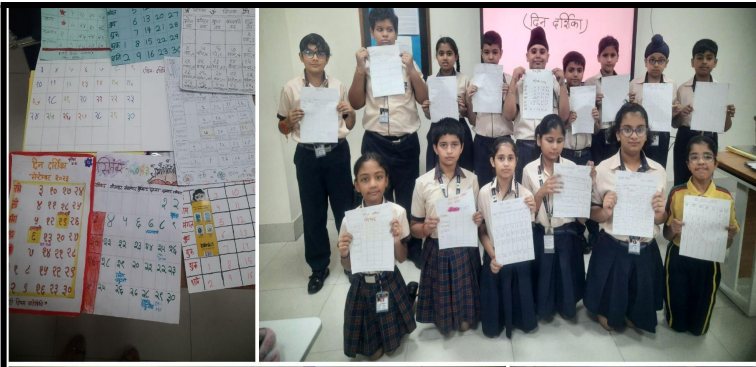

## 3. General Information
