Greetings!!

As we bid adieu to September and step into October, let's learn a few interesting facts about October. It derives its name from the Latin word "Octo," meaning eight, as it was the eighth month in the Roman calendar and the tenth month in the Gregorian calendar. The Anglo-Saxon name for October is "Winterfylleth". In the Northern Hemisphere, October is known as the middle month of autumn.

The month of September marked the beginning of autumn. As we head into winter and look forward to the festive season, we are also approaching the culmination of the first half of the academic year. Let us all enjoy the chill of winter and reaffirm our pledge for a positive and collaborative alliance amongst the troika of teachers, students, and parents.

During the month of September, the teacher-learner fraternity celebrated **Krishan Janamashtmi, Sanskrit Diwas, Hindi Diwas, Teacher's Day, Literacy Day, and Veer Gatha**. A bouquet of activities, viz., **intramural well-rounded competitions**, were organized with the aim of developing the well-rounded personalities of the students. The students were engaged in numerous curricular and co-curricular activities. Students wholeheartedly participated in various class activities and competitions.

Veer Gatha: The **Gallantry Awards** have been instituted by the Government of India to honour the acts of bravery and sacrifice. These gallantry awards are announced twice a year on the occasion of Republic Day and Independence Day. With an aim to proliferate the acts of bravery and the life stories of these brave hearts amongst the students, interdisciplinary and art-integrated activities such as poems, paragraphs, essays, paintings, multimedia presentations, etc. were conducted.

Special Assembly on Sanskrit Diwas: Sanskrit Diwas was celebrated on September 1st in IHS to create awareness and promote one of the ancient and oldest Indian languages, the foundation of different classical texts in fields like literature, Philosophy, mathematics, and Science. Students of Grade VII participated in the song, dance, and anchoring during the assembly.

Hindi Diwas: Hindi Diwas is celebrated on the 14th of September every year. The students of Grade 7 also celebrated Hindi Diwas in school by means of slogan writing and poster making related to Hindi.

Special Assembly on Janmashtami: IHS celebrated the birthday of Shri Krishna, the Guru of all gurus, the divine hero. Krishna is the embodiment of his own teachings, and the *Bhagavad Gita* is his greatest message, his mission to deliver us the knowledge that you have always longed to seek. Students of Grade VII prayed to Lord Krishna with a medley of bhajans, followed by Thought of the Day with one of Krishna's important teachings, "You have the right to work but not the fruit of work." Students of Grade VII performed a dance drama depicting Kanha's birth, his childhood, and the "Victory of Good over Evil" by defeating King Kansa.

Teacher's Day Celebration: The 5th of September is celebrated as Teachers' Day in memory of Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan and to honour the contributions he made to the field of education. It is also celebrated to remember all teachers in gratitude for their extreme commitment and efforts in building a civilized society. Students of Grade VII also celebrated and enjoyed the day with their teachers. They presented a card and flower to show their love, gratitude, and respect for their teachers.

International Literacy Day: UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization) : To make everyone aware of UNESCO's mission of building a culture of peace, eradication of

poverty, sustainable development, and intercultural dialogue through education, a UNESCO logo/poster-making activity was conducted in Grade VII.

Swachhata Pakhwada: CBSE activity **Swachhata Pakhwada** was conducted for the students. Students were sensitized about hygiene and the importance of cleanliness. The Swachhata Pledge was taken, where students promised to keep the planet green.

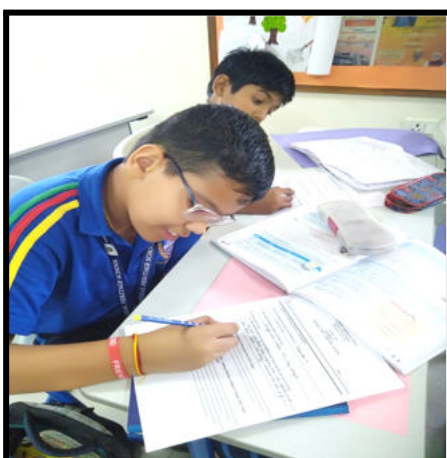
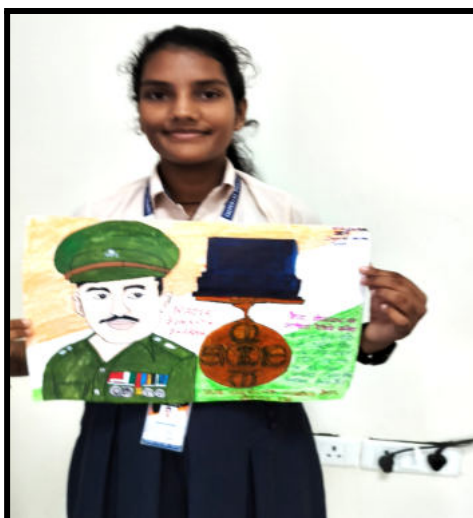

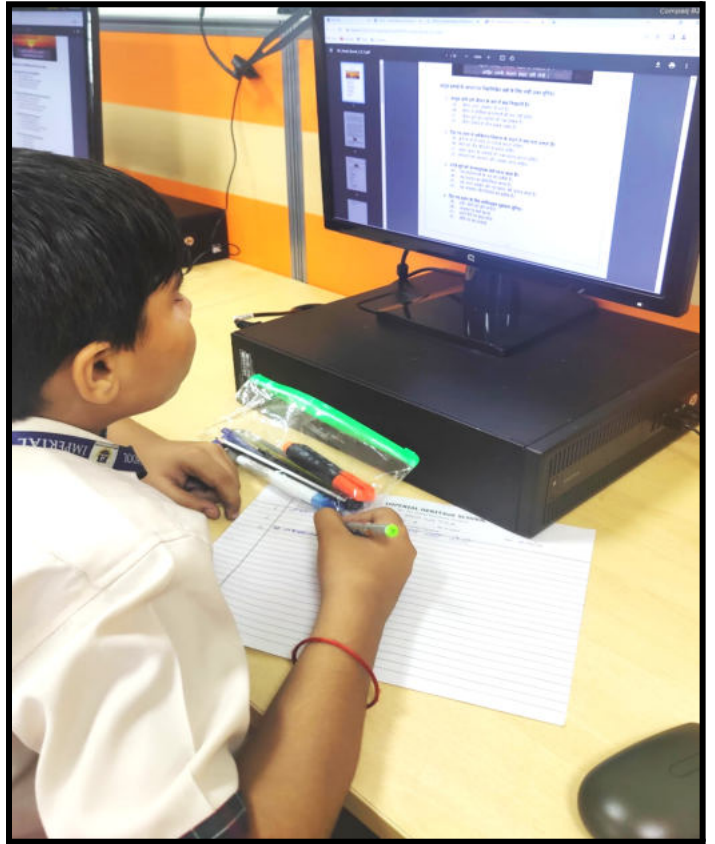
