On the academic front, students were engaged in learning about different topics. In EVS theme Animals, students learnt about different types of animals, herbivores and carnivores, animal patterns, animals homes and animal babies. To make learning fun, students engaged in class discussions, contributing prior knowledge and making real life connections. They spoke about pet, domestic and wild animals and also shared their experiences on trips to the zoo. Making learning fun, they enjoyed singing rhymes-Bunny Rabbit and Alice Camel.

The end of August celebrates National sports Day to mark the birth anniversary of Hockey wizard, Major Dhyan Chand. In recognition of the importance of sports in one's life, Kindergarten students participated in Fun races.
