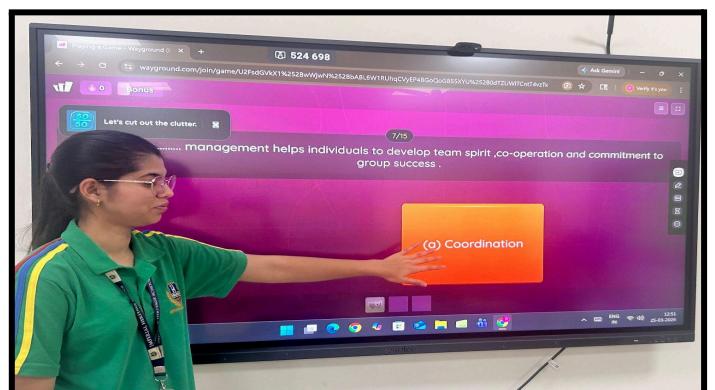
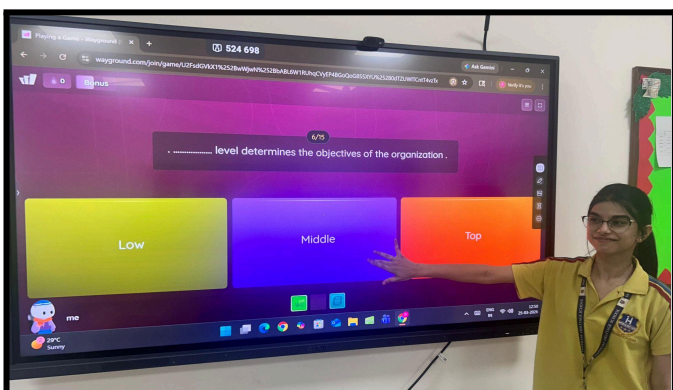
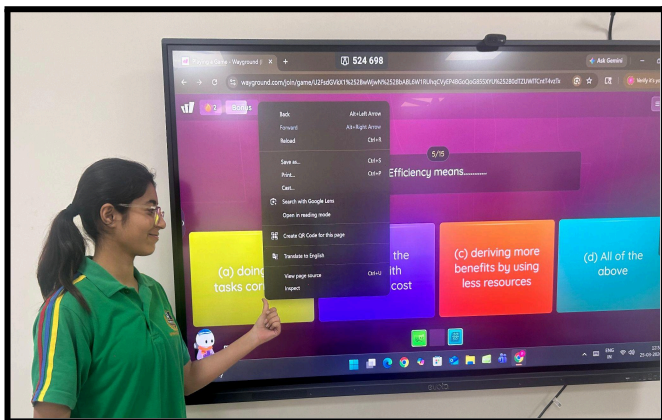
responsibilities of scientists. Overall, it was an informative and engaging learning experience.

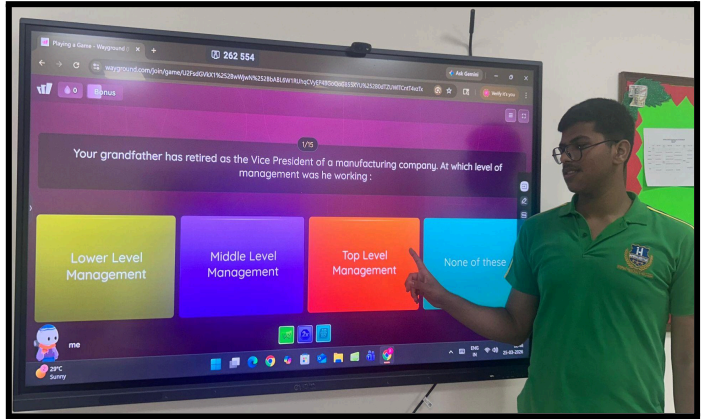
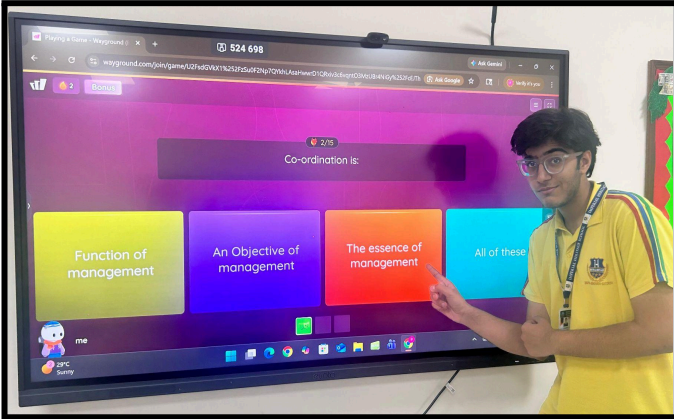
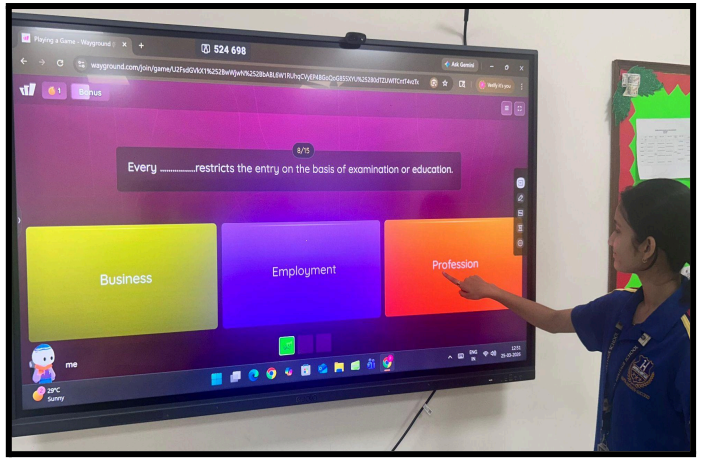
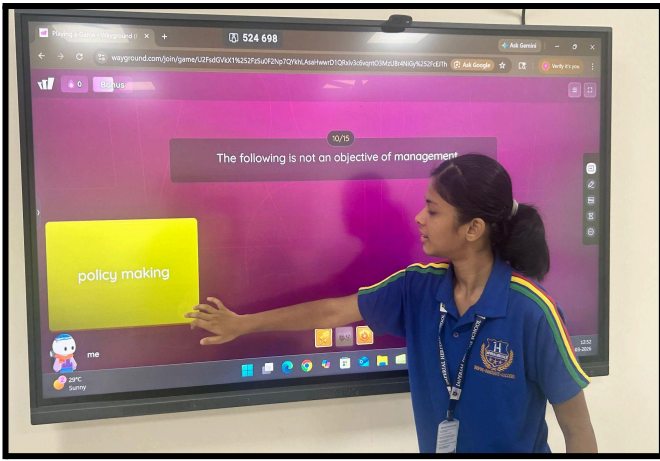
