Students returned to school after a long summer break, looking forward to what was in store for them at school. And they were not disappointed as the month was full of excitement, where they were engaged in different activities to keep them occupied. The students took pride in presenting their holiday homework that they had done with a lot of enthusiasm and creativity. They presented their 3D masks of Indian heritage, which were a part of their holiday homework, in a marching parade with a lot of zeal and excitement. Students also participated in an Intra Class Diorama Competition.

In **English**, to introduce the concept of *Doing Words*, an engaging 'Simon Says' activity was conducted in the school playground, transforming learning into movement and fun. Students eagerly followed action-based commands—jump, run, clap—only when "Simon said," helping them physically experience verbs through play. This dynamic approach deepened their understanding of action words while fostering listening and response skills. The session concluded with a creative *Action Tree*, where students illustrated various verbs and showcased their grasp through beautifully crafted notebook presentations.

In **Math**, the concept of *Addition* was introduced through interactive tools like number lines and abacus beads, making learning both visual and hands-on. A number line—with its evenly spaced intervals—helped students understand the sequence of numbers and grasp how addition moves us forward along the line. Using this tool, children identified and located numbers before solving additional sums with confident jumps. The abacus, with its tactile charm, offered another layer of engagement, allowing young learners to count, group, and add with clarity. These activities turned abstract numbers into tangible steps, sparking curiosity and reinforcing foundational skills with every move.

In **EVS** students enthusiastically explored the theme of *Community Helpers* through a lively blend of enactment and model-making. Choosing roles ranging from doctors and chefs to teachers and postmen, they not only performed with confidence and creativity but also built miniature workstations that reflected thoughtful details and imaginative flair. Their expressive lines and playful dramatizations brought everyday heroes into focus, transforming the classroom into a vibrant hub of service, teamwork, and discovery.

Father's Day is a cherished occasion that honors the unwavering love, strength, and support of fathers. To celebrate this meaningful bond, students crafted delightful French fry-themed cards, using playful creativity to express heartfelt emotions. Each fry carried a carefully chosen adjective—kind, brave, funny, wise—painting a vivid portrait of the unique roles their dads play. Through this thoughtful activity, children not only shared warm sentiments but also deepened their understanding of gratitude and appreciation, adding a personal touch to a day dedicated to family love.

Maadhyam scheduled for 23rd August, where schools from across the city will join us for a day of creativity, competition, and collaboration.

















































































