In the month of July, Team IHS focused on reconnecting and assessing the students to set the tone after summer vacations. As the gentle breeze of August sweeps in, it brings with it a spirit of renewal, hope, and joy. Known for its vibrant energy and meaningful celebrations, August is a month that reminds us of the strength of unity, the richness of culture, and the joy of togetherness. This month, we look forward to celebrating important **festivities and national pride**, including **Independence Day**, a time to honor our heritage and the freedom we cherish. August also marks the onset of **Raksha Bandhan**, celebrating the bond between siblings, and the arrival of **Krishna Janmashtami**, a festival filled with devotion, stories, and joy.

School events are special educational activities beyond the classroom. Students of IHS always have full schedules for building their character. Extracurricular activities allow students to learn many essential life skills such as cooperating with others, widening their social circle, better time management, problem-solving, and fostering self-confidence. Keeping this in mind, students of Grade XI Humanities participated in various activities in the month of July.

Book week is a time-honored celebration to raise awareness among students on the importance of books and literature. Throughout the five-day celebration, there were many activities conducted, like:

"Collaborative Unfinished Stories" activity was held on 14th July 2025. Students of Grade XI were divided into four groups and given unique opening lines to creatively complete as a team. The activity sparked imagination, encouraged teamwork, and enhanced storytelling skills. Each group presented their stories with enthusiasm, showcasing creativity and collaboration. The event was an enjoyable and enriching experience, allowing students to express themselves creatively.

As part of CBSE's emphasis on promoting reading habits among students, **D.E.A.R. Day (Drop Everything And Read)** was observed in school with great enthusiasm on 15th July. At a designated time during the school day, students and teachers across all classes paused their regular activities and engaged in uninterrupted reading. This initiative aimed to encourage a love for books, enhance concentration, and develop language skills. **Intra-class Quiz** competition based on Idiom Match-up was held to discover the rich and varied expressions and also to enhance vocabulary and comprehension skills in the English language.

A special assembly on “**Book Week**” was conducted by the students of Grade XI. The assembly signified the importance of books in each and every person’s life. The students conveyed a strong message about literacy and equal opportunity. The assembly was both engaging and meaningful, leaving a lasting impact on the audience. It reflected the values of awareness, creativity, and social change through books.

Under CBSE **Project: Dolphin**, an activity, a video based on dolphins, was shown to students. The aim was to raise awareness among students about the vital role dolphins play in aquatic ecosystems and the urgent need to protect them from threats like pollution and habitat loss.

The **Parent Orientation** was conducted on Saturday, 5th July, to provide parents with essential information about the academic year, school policies, and the support system available to their children. This session aimed to bridge the communication gap between the school and parents, ensuring a collaborative effort in fostering students' growth and development. Parents actively participated in the Q&A session, providing valuable insights and feedback. The orientation highlighted the school's dedication to providing a supportive and comprehensive educational environment for students.

In the **Inter-House Competition**, students of Grade XI participated in a **Podcast spectrum** on the topic “Importance of Mother Tongue or Regional Language in our lives”. I am very happy to announce that **Akul Dhaka** (Warriors House) secured the first position in this competition.

An activity – Role Play was conducted with reference to the chapter – ‘Mother’s Day’ as a part of the Grade XI **English** curriculum on 10th July, 2025. The role play was aimed at helping students explore important themes such as gender roles within the family, emotional labor, and the need for respect and recognition of a mother’s contributions.

To enhance students' understanding of medieval European cathedral towns and the architectural elements of cathedral churches through visual learning and creative expression, a guided sketching activity was conducted in **History**, where students created their own renditions of cathedral churches. As part of the lesson on *Cathedral Towns and Church Architecture*, students were introduced to the historical, cultural, and architectural significance of cathedrals in medieval towns.

On 10th July, in accordance with CBSE guidelines, a special assembly and classroom discussions were organized on the theme of “**Samvidhan Hatya Diwas**”, focusing on: The significance of the Indian Constitution and the historical instances of Emergency where constitutional values may have been undermined. Teachers guided students to understand how the constitution ensures justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity for all citizens. “**Samvidhan Hatya Diwas**” served as a powerful reminder to protect and uphold the values enshrined in the Indian Constitution. The aim of this CBSE activity was to sensitize students about the importance of the Indian Constitution, its democratic principles, and to critically reflect on any perceived threats or violations to constitutional values in the past or present. The activity encouraged awareness, critical thinking, and civic responsibility among students.

On 14th July, as per **CBSE’s Sadak Suraksha Abhiyaan**, a Road Safety Anthem in Hindi was played, highlighting the importance of following traffic rules and being responsible citizens. The anthem's impactful lyrics and tune emphasized safety, caution, and civic sense on the road.

This was followed by a short film that depicted real-life scenarios and consequences of reckless driving, underage driving, and the significance of wearing helmets and seatbelts. The session served

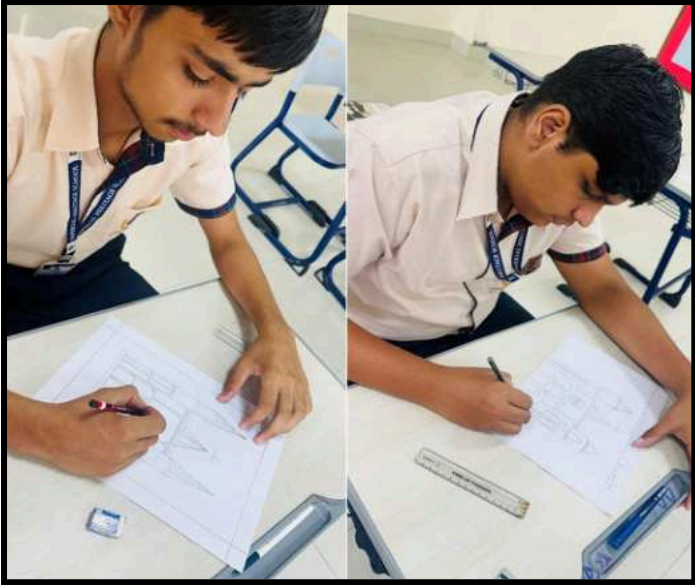
as a powerful reminder to prioritize safety and follow road regulations to prevent accidents and save lives.
