This heartfelt gesture aimed to make our soldiers feel the warmth of home even while on duty. The activity also helped students understand the true spirit of Raksha Bandhan — love, protection, and unity.

As part of **CBSE** awareness drives, our students were sensitized to dolphin conservation, taking a pledge to avoid shows involving dolphins in captivity. They also participated in the Sadak Suraksha Abhiyan, learning about road safety through an engaging and age-appropriate video.

The value of the month was **KINDNESS** and students began their lesson on kindness by watching a video that illustrated the meaning and importance of being kind to others. This visual introduction helped them grasp the concept through real-life examples and stories. Following the video, they read a book about kindness, which further reinforced the ideas they had seen and introduced new perspectives on how to be kind in various situations.

Children also did a lot of hands-on activities in different subjects to understand various concepts which were introduced to them. In **English** to make learning punctuation fun and interactive, students created colorful punctuation puppets. As the teacher read out sentences, they eagerly identified and raised the correct puppet — whether it was a full stop, question mark, or exclamation mark. The activity not only reinforced their understanding of punctuation marks but also added creativity and excitement to the lesson.

In **E.V.S**, in our recent exploration of the chapter Plants Around Us, we began with an engaging video that showcased various types of trees and illustrated how different plants thrive in diverse climates. This visual introduction set the stage for a deeper understanding of plant life. Following the video, students made a scrapbook of plants where they collected pictures of different plants like trees, shrubs, herbs, climbers and creepers and pasted them in a scrapbook and explained about them in a few lines. In another activity children made a plant life cycle model using paper plates where they showcased the different stages of plant growth from seed to big tree.

While studying multiplication in **Mathematics**, students participated in "Clapping Facts" activity to help children revise their multiplication tables in an interactive and energetic manner. Each child took turns picking a chit from the box, reading the multiplication problem aloud, solving it mentally, and then clapping as many times as the

answer. The students enthusiastically participated in an engaging and fun-filled multiplication activity named Kaboom. In this game, ice cream sticks were used, each labelled with a multiplication sum or the word "Kaboom". Children took turns picking up sticks from a container. If a student picked a stick with a multiplication sum, they had to solve it mentally and give the correct answer to stay in the game and earn points for their team. However, if they picked a "Kaboom" stick, they were eliminated from the round, creating moments of surprise and excitement. The activity not only encouraged quick mental calculations but also promoted teamwork, focus, and a love for learning mathematics in a playful environment.

Parents were full of praise for the creativity, effort, and awareness showcased by our students.
