On the academic front, subjects were taught in an interactive and engaging manner, using activities that sparked curiosity and encouraged active participation among Grade V students. An activity based on **nouns and adjectives** was conducted **in the Hindi** class. In this activity, the children drew a beautiful picture of a **noun** and then came up with suitable **adjectives** to describe it. The students thoroughly enjoyed the activity and, through playful learning, understood how to form adjectives from nouns. This engaging activity also helped in enhancing their **creative and imaginative skills**.

A fun and educational activity was organized in **Sanskrit**, in which students learned how to tell time in the Sanskrit language. The objective of this activity was not only to help students understand the concept of time but also to familiarize them with the practical use of Sanskrit. This activity sparked the students' interest in Sanskrit and helped them enjoy using the language in a practical way. It was a successful effort that beautifully blended language learning with real-life application.

In **Science**, students engaged in a hands-on science activity to explore the concepts of solubility and miscibility in solids, liquids, and gases. Through simple experiments and demonstrations, they observed how different substances interact, encouraging curiosity and deeper understanding. They also examined the difference between physical and chemical changes by comparing the tearing and burning of paper. It was a day of experiential learning, where scientific concepts became clear and meaningful through active participation.

To foster literacy and a love for reading, the school organized an enriching **Book Week** from 14th to 18th July 2025, as part of the 2025–26 academic session. A host of thoughtfully curated activities—*Special Assembly on Book Week, D.E.A.R.* (*Drop Everything And Read*), *Book Cover Intra-Class Competition*, and the *Inter-House Storytelling Trays Competition*—offered students a joyful and immersive literary experience. These engaging events sparked creativity, promoted reading for pleasure, and encouraged self-expression through various literary forms, making the week a true celebration of books and imagination.

As part of **CBSE** awareness initiatives, our students were sensitized to dolphin conservation, taking a pledge to avoid supporting shows that involve dolphins in captivity. They also took part in the Sadak Suraksha Abhiyan, learning about road safety through an engaging and age-appropriate video. In a heartwarming extension of environmental consciousness, students participated in the 'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam' activity, where they planted a sapling with their mothers in their residential societies — a beautiful gesture to honour both nature and motherhood.

Imperial Heritage School celebrated the National Day of France, better known as Bastille Day or Le Quatorze Juillet, commemorating the storming of the Bastille on 14 July, 1789. 

3. General Information
