Dear Parent,

July went by in a whirlwind! With so many activities planned, the students were brought back to the pulsating rhythm of school life after a refreshing summer break. Here is a quick look at what was accomplished in the month that went by:

• <u>Parent Orientation:</u> The parents had an informative session on 5th July regarding various rules and policies of the school. They were also apprised of the various challenges in the academic journey of the students. Academic expectations from students were shared, highlighting the quality of work submitted. This was followed by a Q/A session with the Principal.

• Book Week (14th July to 18th July)

- Musings of a Poet: Students composed and recited poems of different styles limerick, haiku, tanka and acrostic.
- **DEAR**: As per the announcement, students dropped everything and read! This moment is to take a pause from our busy schedules and indulge in pleasure reading. A must for all of us!
- o **InterHouse Story Writing Competition:** Students wrote a satirical story as part of the inter-house competition. Satire is used to highlight a trend or a belief that one considers silly or not beneficial for society. This is usually done comically, but hoping for a deep impact on people's conscience to bring about a change.
- Intra Class Time's Up! Activity: Students were given two minutes to scan their environment to familiarise themselves with as many words as possible. Thereafter, they wrote down words they could recall in a given time frame. The student who wrote the maximum words was declared the winner. Pens and pencils flew over the paper, and expressions were serious and adorable at the same time.
- <u>Class Presentation:</u> The first of its kind for Class VI, this was a subject-wise presentation of all the subjects in fun and creative ways. The presentation was based on the theme '*Quality Education*'. Students recited poetry and shlokas, along with confident explanations of PPTs and interactive games for the parents. This was a great opportunity for a 100% participation of the shyest student to the most confident one. At the end, the parents had a lovely surprise as a take-away gift a letter of gratitude and appreciation for all they have done for the wellbeing of their ward.
- **French Day:** The day began with a brief introduction to France's rich cultural heritage on the French Day. Students and teachers had the opportunity to taste French delicacies such as croissants, salad, crêpes, baguettes, and macarons. These dishes brought a true flavour of France to the celebration. The cultural program featured songs, famous artists and famous landmarks.

- <u>Unit Test II</u> Unit Test II provided students with an opportunity to assess their academic progress.
 Despite the testing schedule, students managed their studies and class presentations efficiently, demonstrating responsibility and commitment to learning.
- <u>Kargil Vijay Diwas:</u> Honoring Courage with Gratitude and Peace- Kargil Vijay Diwas commemorates the bravery and sacrifice of Indian soldiers who fought valiantly during Operation Vijay. To instill values of peace, unity, and gratitude among students, a *card making Activity* was conducted in classrooms. The students wrote a heartfelt message of peace or appreciation for the armed forces on a card. The students created a visual representation of the day, covering key aspects like the timeline, success of operation Vijay, impact and memorial.

CBSE Activities conducted were as follows:

- **Project Dolphin:** As part of the activity, students created colourful posters and slogans about dolphin conservation. These were displayed in the school corridor to encourage more students and visitors to learn about Project Dolphin. The students watched videos showing the dolphins' habitat, their behavior, and the threats they face, such as pollution and habitat loss. The Protect Dolphin pledge was taken in the assembly, where the students pledged to save the dolphin.
- Project Sadak Suraksha: Road safety is an important issue, and awareness of rules is a must-know
 for all students. CBSE launched its guidelines in an educative way through short videos focusing on
 how to maintain caution and care while crossing the road, waiting for the bus and many other small
 habits that can save a life or prevent any mishap.
- **'Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam'** In line with CBSE's "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam 2.0" campaign, our students actively participated in the tree plantation drive by planting saplings in their mother's name. This heartfelt initiative not only honored the nurturing spirit of mothers but also reinforced the importance of environmental sustainability and care for the planet.

Subject Enrichment Activities:

- **In science,** the curious young scientists explored the mysteries of magnets. They discovered that magnets are strongest at their poles by testing where the most iron filings stick. By suspending a magnet, they observed that it always points North-South.
- In Maths, students were engaged in an activity showing the length of the longest river of each continent on a bar graph.

- In English, the students wrote a letter of gratitude to their parents for all the love and care they receive throughout their lives. This was in conjunction with the letter writing topic as per the syllabus.
- In Hindi, they performed a short play on 'Meri Maa'. NEP और NCF के निर्देशानुसार कक्षा छठी के छात्रों को मेरी माँ पाठ पर आधारित अभिनय गतिविधि कराई गई, जिसमें सभी बच्चों ने बढ़-चढ़कर भाग लिया इस गतिविधि के माध्यम से बच्चों ने मां की ममता व उनके वात्सल्य प्रेम को भली भांति जाना और इस गतिविधि द्वारा उनकी कल्पनात्मक व मृजनात्मक कौशल का विकास हुआ।
- In Sanskrit, कक्षा 6 में एक रोचक और शिक्षाप्रद गतिविधि का आयोजन किया गया, जिसमें छात्रों ने संस्कृत भाषा में समय बताना सीखा। इस गतिविधि का उद्देश्य न केवल छात्रों को समय की समझ देना था, बल्कि उन्हें संस्कृत भाषा के व्यावहारिक उपयोग से भी परिचित कराना था। शिक्षक ने पहले छात्रों को घड़ी के विभिन्न अंगों और समय बताने से जुड़े संस्कृत शब्दों जैसे "प्रहर", "क्षण", "द्वितीयः", "त्रयोदशवादनम्" आदि का परिचय कराया। इसके पश्चात छात्रों ने स्वयं अभ्यास करते हुए विभिन्न समयों को संस्कृत में बताना सीखा। उदाहरण के लिए, यदि समय 10 बजे था तो छात्र बोले "दशवादनम् अस्ति।"

<u>Value of the month (Kindness):</u> As part of the Value Education programme, students of Grade VI had a thoughtful and engaging discussion on the topic of "Kindness". The session began with students sharing their understanding of what kindness means. Many described it as being polite, helping others, showing empathy, and doing good deeds without expecting anything in return. A few students shared personal experiences where a small, kind gesture, such as helping a friend with their studies or comforting someone upset, made a big difference.

Avid Readers (2024-25): The library recognises the avid readers among the students. Reading is a habit that develops thinking and comprehension skills. It deepens knowledge of vocabulary and builds up conversational skills too. Let's applaud for the avid book worms of the past year!




