Dear Parents,
Greetings!

July was a fun and exciting month for our students! We began with a cheerful Welcome Back Activity that brought big smiles to everyone's faces. The children proudly shared their holiday homework, showcasing a great deal of creativity and joy. On the first day, they enjoyed playful activities such as crawling on the floor, sorting balls by color, and painting with clown noses, which made everyone laugh! Celebrating **Blue Colour Day** was a fun and colorful celebration! All the students came to school dressed in blue outfits and took part in exciting activities that helped them learn about the color blue and marine life. They played sorting games using blue balls, ice cream sticks, lids, and toy boats, which made learning fun and hands-on. The children also enjoyed a creative art activity where they painted paper plates blue to make a beautiful ocean. To explore triangles in **Numeracy**, they enjoyed drawing and making triangle shapes through creative craft work. They also participated in various concept-based activities to reinforce their learning. Along with this, students learned the pre-concept of '**in**' and '**out**' through engaging hands-on activities that helped them understand spatial awareness in a fun way. They practiced writing and recapped the letters L, T, and I, as well as the number 1 in their notebooks, which supported the development of their early writing and number skills.

Book Week was an enriching experience for our young learners. They participated in a variety of activities that sparked their creativity and love of reading. The children enjoyed making a craft based on *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle, created their colorful bookmarks—including fun Doraemon bookmarks—and enthusiastically participated in the ‘My Favorite Cartoon Character’ competition. The school also organised a delightful puppet show that left the children beaming with joy and laughter! The story revolved around everyone's favorite character—Mickey Mouse—as he celebrated his birthday with his friends. The colorful puppets, lively music, and cheerful storytelling created a magical atmosphere that had all the children glued to their seats. It was a fun-filled week that encouraged imagination, expression, and a deeper connection with books.

Father's Day was a delightful and exciting day for our young learners. With the help of their teachers, they made wonderful handmade cards for their fathers, filled with love and creativity. It was a heartwarming activity that brought big smiles and made the day truly special.

In July, our **Value of the Month** was kindness. Students learned about the importance of helping others, particularly those in need. As part of this, they were taught how to assist blind individuals in crossing the road safely. Our school enthusiastically participated in the event and brought home several accolades, showcasing the talent, dedication, and hard work of our young learners.

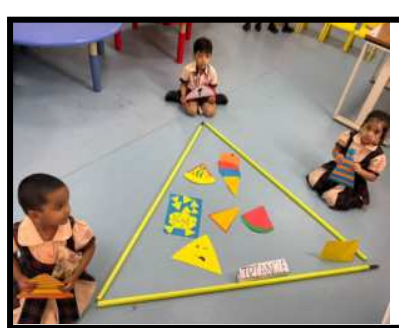
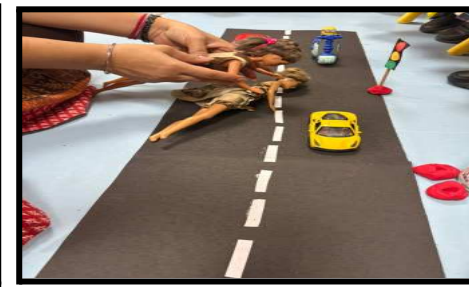
1st Position – Fashion Show: Tiwana
