**Dear Parents,
Greetings!**

After the summer holidays, students came back to school with happy faces and lots of energy. The new academic year had already started, and their return brought more excitement to the classrooms. They were glad to meet their friends and teachers again. Students proudly displayed their creative holiday homework, sharing their ideas and efforts with everyone! Academic learning in the classroom was thoughtfully integrated with a variety of engaging activities. Through hands-on tasks, interactive sessions, and creative exercises, concepts were made clear and enjoyable. These activities not only supported academic understanding but also encouraged curiosity, participation, and critical thinking, making learning a meaningful and joyful experience for all.

In **Literacy**, children were introduced to the letters **Ee, Ff, Gg, and Hh**. They learned how to recognize, trace, and write these letters correctly, both in uppercase and lowercase. The children also explored the **phonetic sounds** of each letter through engaging activities like **storytelling, songs, flashcards, object association**, and **art-based worksheets**. These fun-filled activities helped them connect each letter to its sound and everyday objects (like *E for elephant, F for fish*, etc.), making early reading enjoyable.

In **Numeracy**, the children learned numbers **11 to 16**. They were introduced to the **concept of tens and ones**, which helped them thoroughly understand place value. Using colourful **abacus beads**, number cards, and hands-on counting activities, children practiced counting and identifying these numbers. They also engaged in games, puzzles, and number-writing exercises to build a strong foundation in number sense.

Under the **Pre-Math Concepts**, children explored the idea of **In and Out**. Through interactive games like placing toys ‘in’ the basket or ‘out’ of the basket, they learned to differentiate and use the terms correctly in context. The concept was reinforced through story-based activities and visual aids. They also learned about the **shape ‘Triangle’** by identifying it in their surroundings, making triangle crafts, and singing shape songs. They enjoyed tracing, colouring, and building triangles using sticks and blocks.

In **Environmental Studies (EVS)**, the children explored the fascinating world of **plants**. They learned about different parts of a plant, the basic needs of a plant to grow—**sunlight, water, air, and soil**—and the names of common plants around us. Through **planting seeds, nature walks, picture books, and interactive discussions**, they observed real plants and began to understand their importance in our lives. In the **What Plants Need to Grow Activity**, children learned about the essential elements required for plant growth – sunlight, water, soil, and air. They planted seeds in small pots, watered them, and placed them in sunny spots. Over the days, they observed the changes and growth in their plants, understanding the basic science of nature and developing responsibility and care for living things.

During the **Father’s Day Craft** activity, children joyfully created beautiful cards and small handmade gifts using colourful paper, glitter, stickers, and messages to express their love and appreciation for their fathers. They shared sweet thoughts about their dads and were excited to take their creations home as a surprise.

Book Week was a celebration of imagination and storytelling. The children were introduced to a variety of engaging picture books, listened to animated read-aloud sessions, dressed up as their favourite book characters, and participated in discussions and fun book-themed games, helping them develop a love for reading. Inspired by the work of the renowned author and illustrator, the **Eric Carle Craft** involved children using paper plates and paint to create their collaged artwork of characters like ‘The Grouchy Caterpillar’. This hands-on activity helped develop their fine motor skills and appreciation for storytelling through art. In the **My Dancing Pencil Craft**, children designed and decorated fun pencil puppets using cutouts, googly eyes, and colourful embellishments. They gave their ‘dancing pencils’ expressions and names, making writing and drawing more enjoyable. The **Panchatantra Story (Intra-Class Competition)** encouraged public speaking as children narrated age-old moral tales with confidence and expression. This not only boosted their communication skills but also taught them life lessons in a fun and meaningful way. For **Rakhi Making for the Soldiers**, children made beautiful, handcrafted rakhis using colourful threads, beads, sequins, and foam cutouts. These were sent to Indian soldiers as a gesture of love and gratitude for their service, instilling a sense of patriotism and empathy in the young learners. The school also organised a delightful puppet show that left the children beaming with joy and laughter! The story revolved around everyone's favorite character—Mickey Mouse—as he celebrated his birthday with his friends. The colorful puppets, lively music, and cheerful storytelling created a magical atmosphere that had all the children glued to their seats. It was a fun-filled week that encouraged imagination, expression, and a deeper connection with books.

Our Pre-Primary students enjoyed a fun and engaging puppet show. The show featured colorful puppets of friendly animals like a lion, elephant, monkey, rabbit and parrot. Through a joyful story, the animals taught the children about kindness, friendship and helping each other. Each puppet had a unique voice and action, which kept the little ones excited and involved. It was a wonderful learning experience full of laughter, fun and valuable lessons.

Colour Burst – BLUE was a theme day filled with colour exploration. The children dressed in blue, brought blue-coloured toys or objects from home,

and participated in art activities such as sponge painting, tearing and pasting, and colouring within blue-themed pictures like oceans and raindrops. In the **Lighthouse in Ocean Craft**, the children crafted a scenic view of a lighthouse standing tall in the ocean using paper plates, paints, cotton for clouds, and glitter for waves. This creative task allowed them to understand the concept of light guiding ships while practicing cutting and assembling skills.

On **Monsoon Mania (Bagless Day)**, children came without school bags and enjoyed a fun-filled day doing crafts like paper umbrellas, clouds, and raindrops. They participated in theme-based activities, sang rain songs, enjoyed storytelling, and experienced sensory play related to the rainy season, making the day full of joyful learning.

As part of **CBSE awareness initiatives**, our students were sensitized to the importance of dolphin conservation, taking a pledge to avoid supporting shows that involve dolphins in captivity. They also took part in the Sadak Suraksha Abhiyan, learning about road safety through an engaging and age-appropriate video. In a heartwarming extension of environmental consciousness, students participated in the ‘Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam’ activity, where they planted a sapling with their mothers in their residential societies — a beautiful gesture to honour both nature and motherhood.
