Dear Parents,

Greetings and welcome back!

Vacation is the period during which students relax, spend quality time with their friends and family, and hone their co-curricular and extra-curricular skills. The students were once again excited to come to school. The month of July began with excitement where the students were engaged in different activities to keep them occupied. They also shared how they spent their summer break. The month began with welcoming the students with a beautiful Welcome back craft.

On the academic front, students were introduced to cursive writing through engaging letter stories and hands-on clay moulding activities. In numeracy, the concept of tens and ones (1–70) was introduced along with recapitulation of key concepts like missing numbers, and identifying numbers that come before, after, and between—reinforced through a variety of interactive activities.

Under the theme ‘***Plants***’, students explored the fascinating world of flora through a range of experiential learning opportunities. They learnt about the process of germination, parts of a plant and their functions, different types of plants, the benefits we derive from them, and the basics of photosynthesis. The concept of plant parts was introduced with a lively rhyme, helping children understand and remember the roles of roots, stems, leaves, and flowers in a fun, musical way.

Several hands-on activities enriched their learning experience. Children observed, compared, and sorted seeds based on size, shape, and texture. Nature walks allowed them to identify plants in their surroundings and discuss their similarities and differences. Gardening tasks like planting, watering, and caring for plants gave them a sense of responsibility and connection to the natural world. They also engaged in sorting and categorising plants based on their colour, shape, or type (flowers, trees, vegetables), and expressed their understanding through plant-themed artwork using clay, watercolours, seeds, and more. 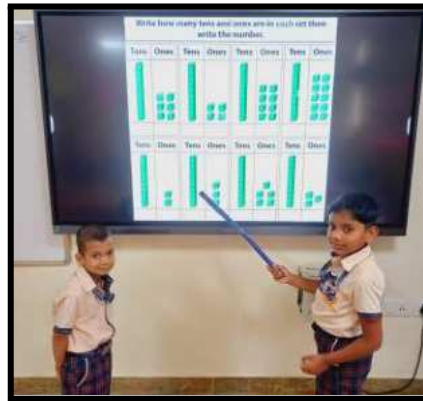

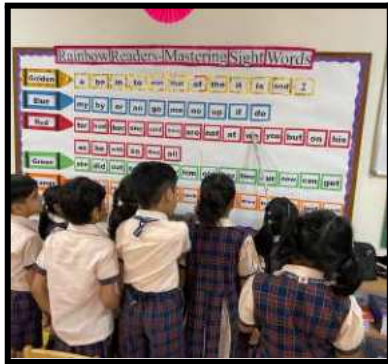
