Bringing along books of their choice, they immersed themselves in captivating stories and enriching ideas in a calm and focused environment. The activity fostered a love for reading, encouraged independent learning, and highlighted the importance of making reading a daily habit.

Students also participated enthusiastically in the **Essay Writing Intra-Class Competition** on 15th July on the theme "Role of AI in Building a Viksit Bharat by 2047." The competition encouraged participants to explore the transformative potential of Artificial Intelligence in shaping India's future while showcasing their creativity, critical thinking, and writing skills. The activity successfully nurtured research, analytical thinking, and responsible citizenship in alignment with **the CBSE General Studies curriculum**. **Harshika** bagged the

SEA MATHEMATICS - A subject enrichment activity was conducted in the Mathematics class to revise Arithmetic Progressions (AP) through a play-way method. They participated enthusiastically and enjoyed learning the concept in a fun and interactive way. The activity encouraged logical thinking, observation, and problem-solving skills while reinforcing the concept of Arithmetic Progressions.

SEA ECONOMICS - Students performed the "One Product, Three Sectors" activity, where they traced the journey of any product through the Primary, Secondary, and Tertiary Sectors of the economy. The activity helped students understand the interdependence of different sectors and relate theoretical concepts to real-life production processes. It enhanced their analytical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and application-based learning skills while strengthening conceptual clarity about the sectors of the Indian economy.

SEA PHYSICS - In the Physics lab, students of Grade X performed an experiment to find the focal length of a convex lens. This hands-on experience helped them to understand the theoretical topic in a better way.
