As the refreshing monsoon welcomes August, we step into a month of vibrant festivals, meaningful learning, and focused preparation for the Term I examinations. These celebrations help children imbibe values of unity, gratitude, and cultural harmony. Your constant encouragement and active partnership with the school play a vital role in your child's holistic development. We sincerely appreciate your support throughout July, a month filled with engaging classroom activities, Book Week celebrations, assemblies, and experiential learning that enriched our students' knowledge, creativity, and confidence.

To promote responsible digital citizenship and create awareness about online safety, a **Cyber Safety Awareness** session was conducted for students on 8th July 2026. As part of the initiative, a specially designed PowerPoint presentation on cyber safety was shown in classrooms across the school. The presentation highlighted essential aspects of cyber security, including creating strong passwords, safeguarding personal information, identifying phishing scams, avoiding cyberbullying, practising responsible social media usage, and reporting suspicious online activities. Students were also made aware of the importance of maintaining digital etiquette and respecting others in the virtual world.

As part of the Book Week Celebrations, students of Grades XI and XII enthusiastically participated in "**The Youth Parliament – Voices for Tomorrow**", a simulated parliamentary discussion on **13th July** on the topic, "Is financial literacy more important than financial assistance for empowering women?" The activity encouraged students to analyse a contemporary social issue, present well-reasoned arguments, and engage in respectful debate. Displaying confidence, critical thinking, and effective communication skills, participants shared diverse perspectives and proposed practical solutions.

On 14th July, Grade XI students presented a special **Book Week Assembly** on the theme "**Swipe Se Shelf Tak – Books vs Screens: The Choice That Shapes You.**" The programme began with the **Gayatri Mantra** and the morning prayer. A thought-provoking skit highlighted the importance of choosing books over excessive screen time, followed by a beautiful poem celebrating the value of books. The performances inspired students to develop a lifelong reading habit and use technology wisely. The assembly concluded with the message that books are the gateway to knowledge, imagination, and personal growth.

As part of the Book Week Celebrations, students of Grades IX to XI enthusiastically participated in **D.E.A.R. (Drop Everything and Read) Day**, setting aside their daily routine to enjoy the pleasure of reading. Bringing along books of their choice, they immersed themselves in captivating stories and enriching ideas in a calm and focused environment. The activity fostered a love for reading, encouraged independent learning, and highlighted the importance of making reading a daily habit.

As part of the Book Week Celebrations, students from Grades IX to XII enthusiastically participated in the **Essay Writing Intra-Class Competition** on 15th July on the theme "Role of AI in Building a Viksit Bharat by 2047." The competition encouraged participants to explore the transformative potential of Artificial Intelligence in shaping India's future while showcasing their creativity, critical thinking, and writing skills. The activity successfully nurtured research, analytical thinking, and responsible citizenship in alignment with the CBSE General Studies curriculum. **Tanvi Yadav** secured 2nd position in the activity.

As part of the Book Week Celebrations, Grade XI students enthusiastically participated in the **Poetry Slam Activity** on 16th July, presenting original self-composed poems on themes of their choice. Through expressive and impactful performances, they shared their thoughts, emotions, and unique perspectives with confidence and creativity. The event showcased the students' literary talent, imagination, and command of language while enhancing their public speaking skills.

UNIT TESTS: Following the summer break, students appeared for the Second Cycle of Unit Tests, providing an opportunity to assess their understanding of concepts. Conducted in July, almost 2 months prior to the Term Examinations, these assessments helped students identify their strengths and areas for improvement, enabling focused preparation and building confidence for the upcoming examinations.

On the occasion of **Kargil Vijay Diwas**, a documentary on the **Kargil War of 1999** was screened for the students of Class XI. The objective of the session was to help students gain a deeper understanding of one of the most significant military operations in India's history and to honour the courage and sacrifice of the Indian Armed Forces.

The documentary highlighted the major events of the Kargil War, including the infiltration by enemy forces, the strategic challenges faced by the Indian Army, and the successful military operations carried out to recapture the occupied peaks. Students also learned about the extraordinary bravery, determination, and patriotism displayed by Indian soldiers during Operation Vijay.

The screening was followed by a brief discussion in which students reflected on the importance of national security, the sacrifices made by the armed forces, and the values of courage, resilience, and unity.
