Our school organized a **Cyber Safety & Cybersecurity Awareness Session** for Grades VI–XII on 7th July 2026, empowering students to become responsible digital citizens. Displaying confidence, critical thinking, and effective communication skills, participants shared diverse perspectives and proposed practical solutions.

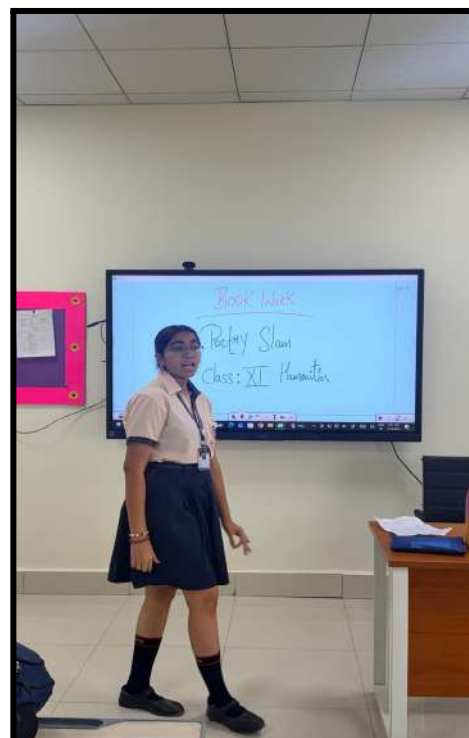
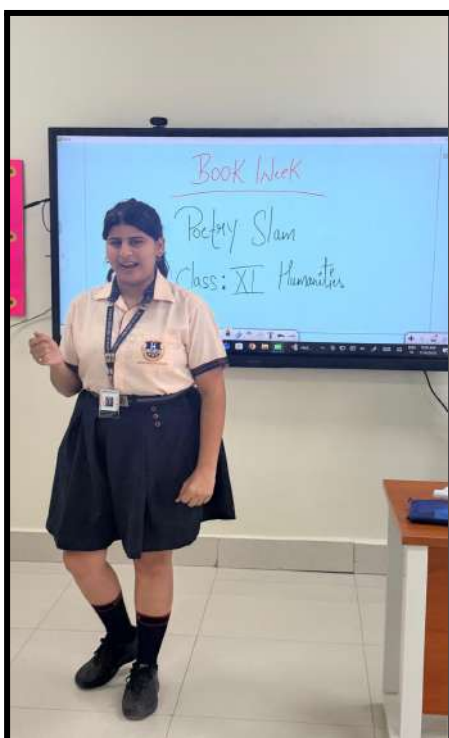
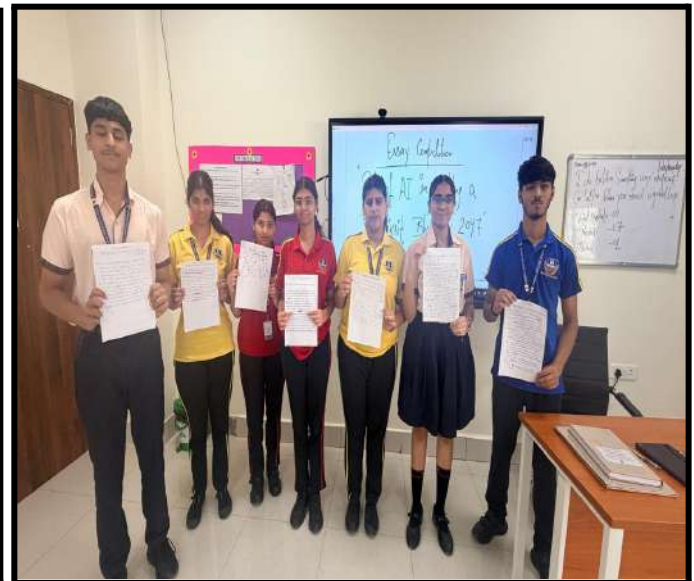
skills while enabling them to appreciate the importance of **cooperative federalism** in ensuring effective governance and balanced development in India.
