Bringing along books of their choice, they immersed themselves in captivating stories and enriching ideas in a calm and focused environment. The activity fostered a love for reading, encouraged independent learning, and highlighted the importance of making reading a daily habit.

As part of the Book Week Celebrations, students from Grades IX to XII enthusiastically participated in the **Essay Writing Intra-Class Competition** on 15th July on the theme "Role of AI in Building a Viksit Bharat by 2047." The competition encouraged participants to explore the transformative potential of Artificial Intelligence in shaping India's future while showcasing their creativity, critical thinking, and writing skills. The activity successfully nurtured research, analytical thinking, and responsible citizenship in alignment with the CBSE General Studies curriculum.

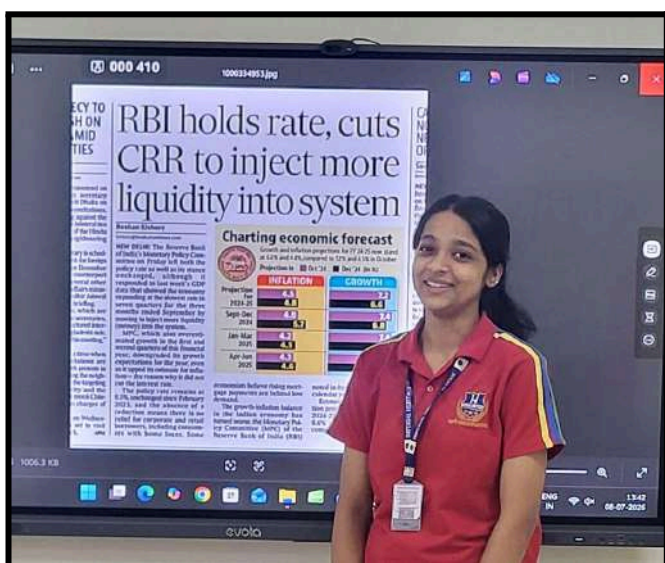
UNIT TESTS: Following the summer break, students appeared for the Second Cycle of Unit Tests, providing an opportunity to assess their understanding of concepts. Conducted in July, almost 2 months prior to the Term Examinations, these assessments helped students identify their strengths and areas for improvement, enabling focused preparation and building confidence for the upcoming examinations.

INDIA -SOUTH KOREA CULTURAL EXCHANGE-IHSians proudly participated in their **first Student Cultural Exchange Programme** with their long-associated partner school in **South Korea**. The visit by a team of 10 delegates was a truly enriching experience, offering students a wonderful opportunity to immerse themselves in a new culture through school visits, meaningful interactions, and lasting friendships. They enjoyed authentic Korean food, vibrant music and dance performances, and engaging cultural activities that made learning both exciting and memorable. This unforgettable journey fostered global understanding, mutual respect, and cherished memories that will remain with the students for years to come.

In **Economics**, students participated in an interactive newspaper analysis activity where they examined current news headlines related to Repo Rate, Reverse Repo Rate, CRR, Bank Rate, and Open Market Operations (OMO). etc., and linked them to the role of the Reserve Bank of India in controlling the money supply. The activity enabled students to analyse real-world economic events, interpret monetary policy decisions, and explain how changes in these instruments influence the availability of money in the economy. It fostered critical thinking, economic reasoning, financial awareness, and the application of theoretical concepts to contemporary economic issues.

In **Business Studies**, students were introduced to various elements of Financial management and the market. In **Accountancy**, students were introduced to the concept of the issue of shares.

Values are an integral part of the curriculum at Imperial Heritage School and a quote by C.S. Lewis, *“Education without values, as useful as it is, seems rather to make man a more clever devil”* resonates the same.
