Kaushal Bodh Activity: Grade VI students participated in the Kaushal Bodh Toy-Making Activity under the CBSE initiative, blending creativity with skill development. They designed board and memory games, sock puppets, and clay toys using simple materials. The activity enhanced fine motor and cognitive skills, encouraged sustainability through upcycled resources, and connected learners to traditional Indian toy-making. It fostered teamwork and showcased students' innovation and craftsmanship in a joyful, hands-on learning experience.

Subject Enrichment: In Mathematics, the "Representing Fractions Using Paper Strips" activity was conducted in the class to help students understand fractions in a fun and hands-on way. Students used paper strips to represent different fractions, identify equal parts, and explore equivalent fractions such as $\frac{1}{2} = \frac{2}{4} = \frac{4}{8}$. The activity enhanced their conceptual understanding, observation skills, and active participation in learning mathematics. **In English,** the students have learnt the basic format of writing an informal letter. They used this skill to write a letter to their classmate in the class and then hand-deliver it within the stipulated time frame. The smiles and cheers on the surprised recipient of the letter were priceless. The students were instructed not to reveal the name of the receiver of the letter. They learnt how to fold the letter into an envelope form, also adding creativity to their thoughts. **In Science,** our Grade VI students enthusiastically participated in an engaging Science Subject Enrichment Activity on the Properties of Magnets. Through hands-on experiments, they discovered that the maximum magnetic strength lies at the poles, observed how like poles repel while unlike poles attract, and explored the working of a magnetic compass to identify directions. They also used the magnetic properties of substances to make a 'dancing snake'.

Star Performer of the month: The Star Performer of the Month was recognized for consistently upholding high standards in both academics and behaviour. Judged on parameters such as discipline, proper uniform,

neat and timely submission of homework and assignments, English speaking, and active participation in class activities, the award celebrates a student who sets an inspiring example for peers.

Value of the month: Kindness in Action

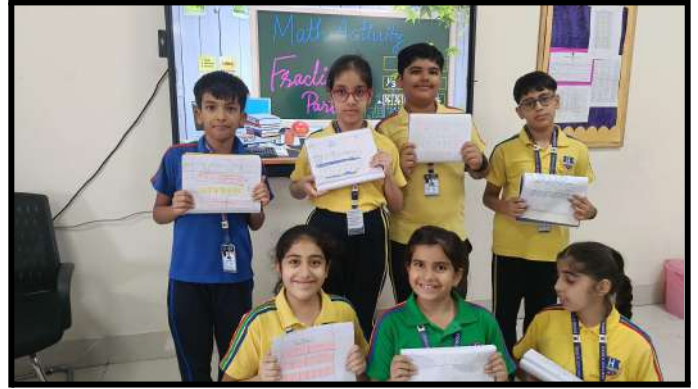
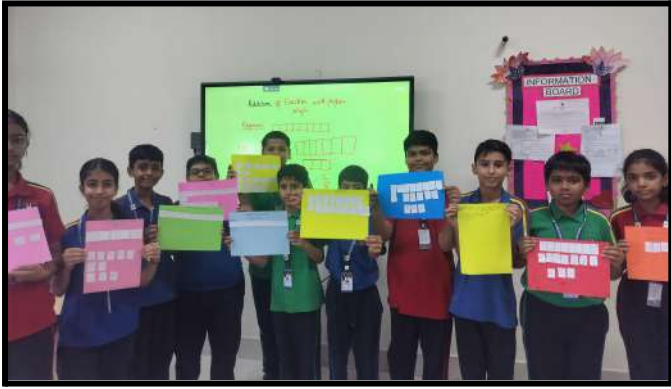

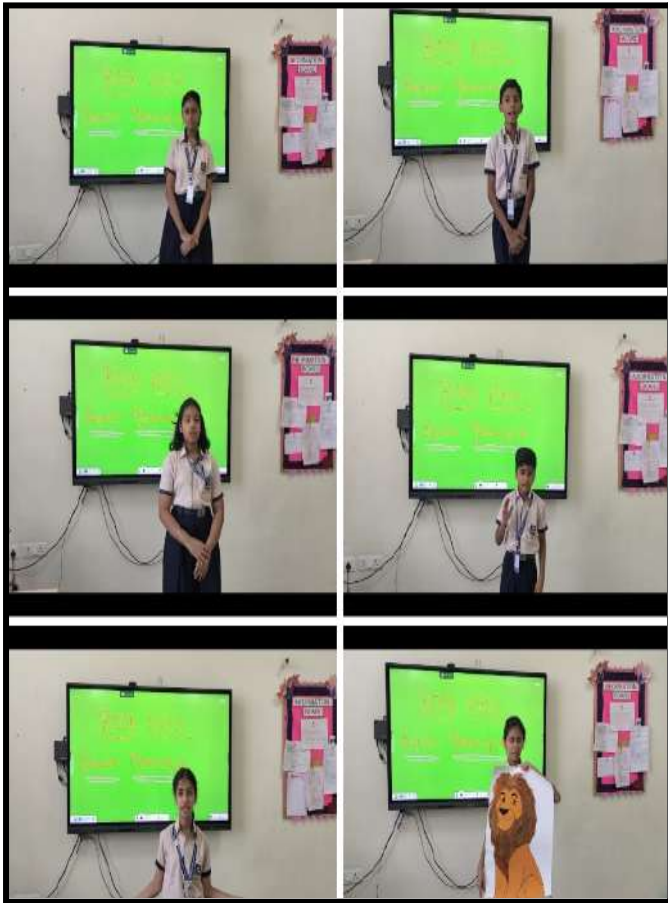
IHS NEWS:
