Greetings from Imperial Heritage School!

With renewed energy after the summer break, July marked a purposeful return to school life. Students settled into their routines, demonstrated their learning through the Second Cycle of Unit Tests, and enthusiastically participated in a host of enriching activities—from Cyber Awareness and Bagless Day to engaging language-based competitions. As we also celebrated Book Week, the words of Charles W. Eliot resonated throughout our campus: *"Books are the quietest and most constant of friends; they are the most accessible and wisest of counsellors."* The month beautifully reflected our commitment to nurturing curious minds, confident learners, and lifelong readers. With patriotism in the air with the onset of August, we move towards a solemn remembrance of those who fearlessly laid their lives for the love and pride of the motherland.

CYBER AWARENESS SESSION: Our school organized a Cyber Safety & Cybersecurity Awareness Session for Grade VI–XII on 7th July 2026, empowering students to become responsible digital citizens. Through an interactive PPT, they explored the importance of digital footprints, online safety practices, and essential security measures. The session also highlighted India's National Cyber Crime Helpline (1930) and official web portal for reporting incidents. A valuable initiative to strengthen awareness, protect young minds, and encourage safe, ethical use of technology in everyday life.

MONOLOGUE: Students had to present themselves as if they were a character from their favourite book. The Monologue activity encouraged students to bring literature to life by stepping into the shoes of their favourite literary characters. Speaking as these characters, participants showcased their creativity, confidence, and expressive skills. The event celebrated imagination, enhanced public speaking abilities, and deepened students' appreciation for literature and storytelling.

SPELL BEE: The Spell Bee competition tested students' spelling accuracy and vocabulary skills using a carefully curated word list. Participants competed with enthusiasm and determination, aiming for perfection. The student who spelt every word correctly emerged as the winner, making the competition both exciting and intellectually rewarding. The students to spell out the words correctly till the end were **Arshbir Singh** Grade VII A, and **Paarth Yadav** Grade VII B, respectively.

BOGGLE TOGGLE: Boggle Toggle challenged students to think quickly and creatively as they formed meaningful words from a letter grid. The activity sharpened vocabulary, improved observation skills, and encouraged strategic thinking under time constraints. It proved to be a fun-filled yet educational competition that kept students actively engaged throughout. The results are shared below.

DEAR: The DEAR programme reinforced the timeless joy of reading by encouraging every student to pause and immerse themselves in a book. Regular reading sessions nurtured comprehension, expanded vocabulary, strengthened language skills, and developed critical thinking. More importantly, they inspired students to cultivate a lifelong love for reading and learning.

UNIT TESTS: Following the summer break, students appeared for the Second Cycle of Unit Tests, providing an opportunity to assess their understanding of concepts. Conducted in July, almost 2 months prior to the Term Examinations, these assessments helped students identify their strengths and areas for improvement, enabling focused preparation and building confidence for the upcoming examinations.

The activity fostered creativity, communication skills, teamwork, imagination, and self-expression, making learning enjoyable and interactive while enhancing their presentation and speaking abilities.

This initiative not only celebrates their hard work and dedication but also encourages others to strive for excellence. The star performers for the month of July are **Nayonika Yadav (Grade VII A)** and **Drishti (Grade VII B)**, respectively.

Value of the Month: The value theme for the month of July was Kindness. Students shared what they thought kindness was and how they experienced it in their daily lives. Everyday examples of helping friends in need, sharing food with friends, offering their seat or a notebook to those in need were some acts of kindness. At home, students realised that lending a helping hand in household chores was also kindness. One of the best responses was shared by Pranav Panchal, Grade VII B, 'Making someone happy is also kindness as happiness means you care for the person.'

Subject enrichment activities: In **Math**, students explored the concept of parallel lines in a fun and artistic way by designing beautiful rangolis and geometric patterns using parallel lines. This hands-on activity blended mathematics with creativity, helping students understand the concept visually while enhancing their imagination, precision, and pattern-making skills. In **English**, the students learnt abstract nouns and framed meaningful sentences with 10 common nouns. Later, they scanned the newspaper to find abstract nouns and pasted the same in their notebooks. This was also helpful in developing skills of skimming and scanning the news and applying a new word in a relevant context. In **Science**, students enthusiastically recapitulated the concepts of acids, bases, and indicators through a hands-on practical activity. They tested common laboratory reagents using natural and synthetic indicators, observed the resulting colour changes, and identified each reagent as acidic, basic, or neutral. The activity strengthened their conceptual understanding, enhanced their observation and analytical skills, and fostered scientific inquiry through experiential learning.
