Greetings from Imperial Heritage School!

Welcome to another exciting month at IHS. We are thrilled to have you as an integral part of our school community. Your dedication and support play a crucial role in shaping our students' success and fostering a nurturing and enriching environment for them to thrive. In this month of learning, students participated in the following activities and competitions.

Cyber Safety & Cybersecurity Awareness Session: Our school organized a Cyber Safety & Cybersecurity Awareness Session for Grade VI–XII on 7th July 2026, empowering students to become responsible digital citizens. Through an interactive PPT, they explored the importance of digital footprints, online safety practices, and essential security measures. The session also highlighted India's National Cyber Crime Helpline (1930) and official web portal for reporting incidents. A valuable initiative to strengthen awareness, protect young minds, and encourage safe, ethical use of technology in everyday life.

French Day Celebration: Imperial Heritage School came alive with the vibrant colours and rich cultural heritage of France as students enthusiastically celebrated French Day through a series of engaging and creative activities. Grade VIII students participated in the Eiffel Tower Construction Challenge, where they displayed remarkable creativity, teamwork, and problem-solving skills while recreating one of France's most iconic landmarks.

Book Week Activities:

- **MONOLOGUE:** Students have to present themselves as if they are a specific character from their favourite book. The Monologue activity encouraged students to bring literature to life by stepping into the shoes of their favourite book characters. Speaking as these characters, participants showcased their creativity, confidence, and expressive skills. The event celebrated imagination, enhanced public speaking abilities, and deepened students' appreciation for literature and storytelling.
- **SPELL BEE:** The Spell Bee competition tested students' spelling accuracy and vocabulary skills using a carefully curated word list. Participants competed with enthusiasm and determination, aiming for perfection. The student who spelt every word correctly emerged as the winner, making the competition both exciting and intellectually rewarding.
- **BOGGLE TOGGLE Intra-Class Competition:** Boggle Toggle challenged students to think quickly and creatively as they formed meaningful words from a letter grid. The activity sharpened vocabulary, improved observation skills, and encouraged strategic thinking under time constraints. - **DEAR:** The DEAR programme reinforced the timeless joy of reading by encouraging every student to pause and immerse themselves in a book. Regular reading sessions nurtured comprehension, expanded vocabulary, strengthened language skills, and developed critical thinking. More importantly, they inspired students to cultivate a lifelong love for reading and learning.

UT II Examination: The **Unit Test II Examination** was conducted smoothly from **22nd to 27th July** in a disciplined and well-organised manner. The assessment provided students with an opportunity to evaluate their understanding of concepts covered after the summer break and encouraged them to consolidate their learning.

Kargil Diwas: As part of the Kargil Vijay Diwas commemoration, the students of Grade VIII participated in a Biography Viewing & Reflection activity to honour the brave soldiers of the Indian Armed Forces. Students watched an inspiring biography of a Kargil War hero, gaining insights into the courage, determination, and selfless service displayed during the conflict.

Following the viewing, students reflected on the soldier's journey by expressing their thoughts, key learnings, and the values that inspired them the most. Through this activity, they developed a deeper appreciation for the sacrifices made by our armed forces and understood the true meaning of patriotism, resilience, and national pride.

CBSE Activities: In accordance with CBSE guidelines, the students enthusiastically participated in the National Poster Making Competition on Heatwave Safety – CBSE 2026. The activity aimed to spread awareness about the increasing risks of heatwaves and the importance of adopting preventive measures to stay safe during extreme weather conditions. Through their imaginative and informative posters, students highlighted key messages such as staying hydrated, avoiding direct exposure to the sun during peak hours, wearing light-coloured clothing, and caring for vulnerable members of the community.

Star Performer: Each month, students who consistently excel in academics, co-curricular activities, discipline, and overall participation are recognised with a Star Performer Certificate. This initiative not only celebrates their hard work and dedication but also encourages others to strive for excellence. The star performers for the month of July from Grade VIII A and VIII B are Manan Narula and Manya Tyagi, respectively.

Kaushal Bodh Activity: Under the **CBSE Kaushal Bodh** initiative, Grade VIII students enthusiastically participated in an engaging **Bamboo Toy Making** activity. This activity was not just about crafting toys—it was about learning the dignity of labour, exploring sustainable materials, and discovering the joy of hands-on creation. Through this project, students experienced the power of experiential learning—transforming raw

materials into meaningful products. They learned essential skills like measurement, cutting, assembling, and finishing, while also developing values of discipline, collaboration, and persistence.

Subject Enrichment Activities: In **Social Science**, students created **comic strips on the theme "Election and Voting."** Through colourful illustrations, creative storytelling, and meaningful dialogues, students depicted the importance of democracy, the electoral process, citizens' rights and responsibilities, and the value of every vote. In **Science**, students performed a hands-on activity using a spring balance to understand the difference between mass and weight by measuring various objects. They also explored friction by observing the movement of objects on slopes with different surface textures, learning how surface irregularities influence friction through practical investigation and observation. In **Mathematics**, students embraced the role of young carpenters in the Carpenter's Problem Activity, transforming simple sticks and threads into a perfect rectangular frame. They explored the properties of the diagonals of a rectangle, discovering that they are equal in length and bisect each other. By measuring, connecting, and adjusting their models with precision, they witnessed how geometry plays a vital role in real-life construction, architecture, and design. In **CT & AI**, students participated in an engaging Inquiry-Based Learning session on Database Management Systems (DBMS). Acting as data detectives, they analysed real-world tables to identify patterns, relationships, and redundancies, developing a deeper understanding of how databases efficiently organize, manage, and retrieve information through critical thinking. In **English**, students referred to the *Newspaper in Education (NIE)* section and were given time to read inspiring write-ups by fellow students who shared the lasting impact of their favourite books and movies. This served as a springboard for the activity '**Beyond the Screen**', designed to nurture reflection, creativity, and expressive writing. Students penned thoughtful responses about a movie scene, character, or portrayal that stayed with them long after the credits rolled, exploring how these stories influenced their thoughts, emotions, or perspectives.

Value of the month: As part of the Value Education programme, students of Grade VIII participated in a **"Kindness vs. No Kindness"** picture activity, where they observed a series of contrasting images and selected the one that best reflected their values. They explained the reasons behind their choices, encouraging empathy, critical thinking, and meaningful discussions about the importance of kindness in everyday life.

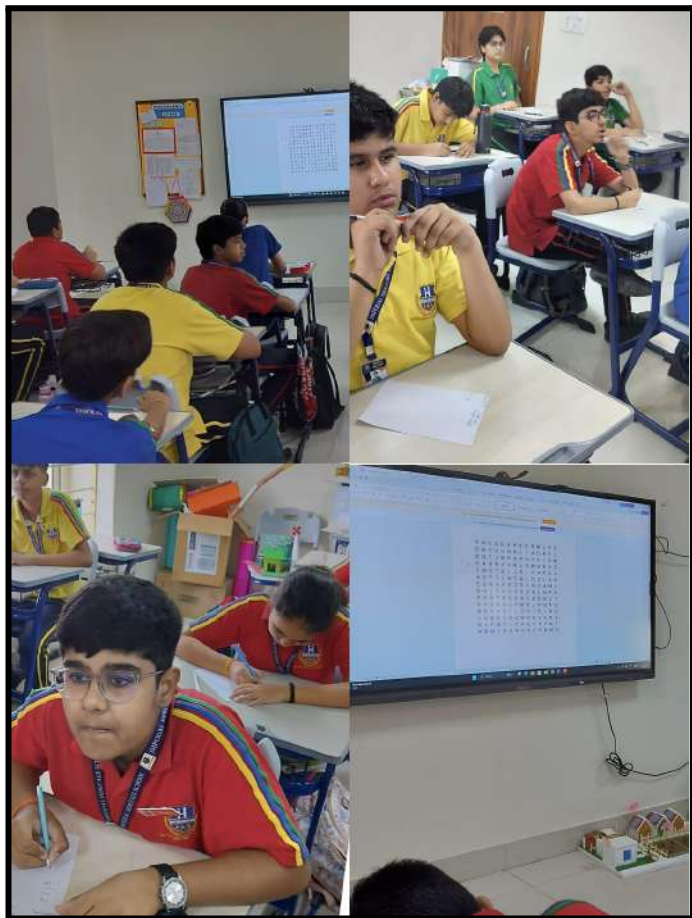
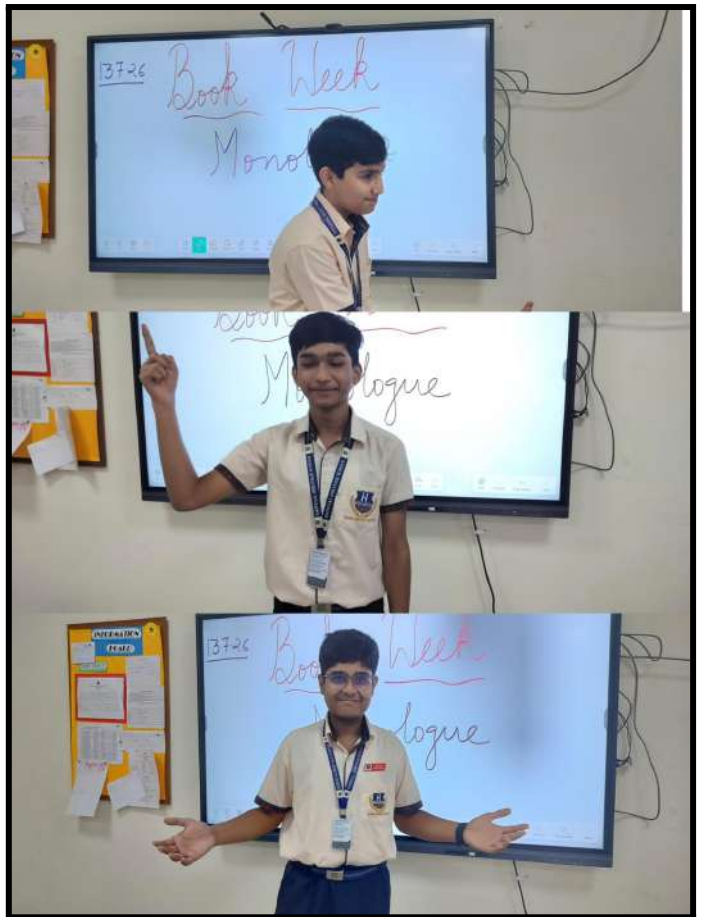
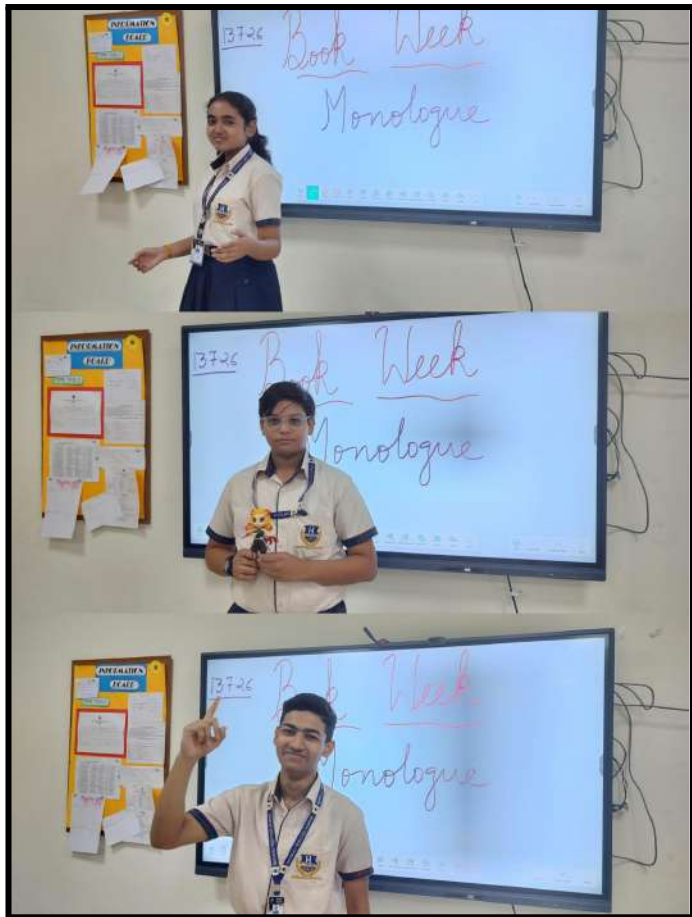
