UNIT TESTS: Following the summer break, students appeared for the Second Cycle of Unit Tests, providing an opportunity to assess their understanding of concepts. Conducted in July, almost 2 months prior to the Term Examinations, these assessments helped students identify their strengths and areas for improvement, enabling focused preparation and building confidence for the upcoming examinations.

Subject Enrichment Activity: Grade IX students explored the concept of motion through a hands-on Physics experiment using an inclined plane. By recording distance at regular time intervals and calculating velocity, they plotted distance–time and velocity–time graphs and observed that the trolley moved with uniform acceleration. The activity helped them understand how graphs represent motion, how acceleration can be determined from the slope of a velocity–time graph, and how experimental observations connect theory with real-life applications.

IHS News-INDIA -SOUTH KOREA CULTURAL EXCHANGE-IHSians proudly participated in their first Student Cultural Exchange Programme with their long-associated partner school in South Korea. 3. General Information
