After the summer break, The **Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM)** was held to provide a wonderful opportunity for parents and teachers to reconnect and discuss the holistic development of the students. Parents were informed about the curriculum, classroom expectations, and the exciting learning experiences planned for the new term. Constructive discussions were held regarding each child's academic progress, social skills, and areas for improvement. The meeting strengthened the partnership between home and school, ensuring a collaborative approach towards nurturing confident, responsible, and happy learners.

Student Exchange Programme - This month started with a high note. INDIA -SOUTH KOREA CULTURAL EXCHANGE-IHSians proudly participated in their **first Student Cultural Exchange Programme** with their long-associated partner school in **South Korea**. The visit by a team of 10 delegation was a truly enriching experience, offering students a wonderful opportunity to immerse themselves in a new culture through school visits, meaningful interactions, and lasting friendships. They enjoyed authentic Korean food, vibrant music and dance performances, and engaging cultural activities that made learning both exciting and memorable. This unforgettable journey fostered global understanding, mutual respect, and cherished memories that will remain with the students for years to come.

In **Literacy**, children were introduced to the letters **Ee, Ff, Gg, and Hh**. They learned how to recognize, trace, and write these letters correctly, both in uppercase and lowercase. The children also explored the **phonetic sounds** of each letter through engaging activities like **storytelling, songs, flashcards, object association, and art-based worksheets**. These fun-filled activities helped them connect each letter to its sound and everyday objects (like *E for elephant, F for fish*, etc.), making early reading enjoyable.

In **Numeracy**, the children learned numbers **11 to 16**. They were introduced to the **concept of tens and ones**, which helped them thoroughly understand place value. Using colourful **abacus beads**, number cards, and hands-on counting activities, children practiced counting and identifying these numbers. They also engaged in games, puzzles, and number-writing exercises to build a strong foundation in number sense.

Under the **Pre-Math Concepts**, children explored the idea of **In and Out**. Through interactive games like placing toys ‘in’ the basket or “out’ of the basket, they learned to differentiate and use the terms correctly in context. The concept was reinforced through story-based activities and visual aids. They also learned about the **shape ‘Square’** by identifying it in their surroundings, and singing shape songs. They enjoyed tracing, colouring, and building squares using sticks and blocks.

In **EVS**, children explored the fascinating world of plants. They learned about the parts of a plant, the basic needs for plant growth—sunlight, water, air, and soil—and identified common plants found around them. They also discovered the various things we get from plants, helping them understand the importance of plants in our daily lives.

To reinforce these concepts, the children enthusiastically participated in the "**What Plants Need to Grow**" activity by planting kidney beans, coriander, and black gram seeds. As they watered and observed their plants each day, they gained a better understanding of how plants grow and change over time. This hands-on experience fostered curiosity, responsibility, patience, and a deeper appreciation for nature.

In **Father’s Day Craft** activity, children lovingly created a beautiful card for their fathers. They made a colourful bouquet of tiny heart cut-outs, symbolising the love, gratitude, and special bond they share with their fathers.

Colour Burst – BLUE was a theme day filled with colour exploration. They dressed in blue attire, brought blue coloured objects from home . They also enjoyed making a delightful blueberries craft, which helped develop their creativity and fine motor skills. The fun-filled activities made learning about the colour blue exciting, interactive, and memorable for everyone.

Book Week was a celebration of imagination and storytelling. Children enjoyed listening to the classic story "The Thirsty Crow." The teacher narrated the story using expressive voice and gestures, helping the children understand its sequence and moral. After the storytelling session, the children enthusiastically coloured a beautiful scene from the story, bringing the characters to life with their creativity. This enjoyable activity enhanced their listening skills, imagination, and love for books while making learning fun. In the second activity of Book Week, children enjoyed a fun activity based on the story *The Cat in the Hat*. They enthusiastically pasted the Cat's famous **red-and-white hat**, completed its **facial features**, and added a **stylish bow** to bring the character to life. This creative activity helped develop their fine motor skills, imagination, and love for books while making story time exciting and memorable.

Grade XI students conducted a special assembly to celebrate **Book Week**, highlighting the importance of books and developing a love for reading. Through an engaging skit, a meaningful poem, and a lively dance performance, they encouraged students to balance screen time with reading and showed how books help us learn, imagine, and grow. The assembly also celebrated the achievements of Olympiad medal winners and Taekwondo champions. During her address, our Principal Ma'am encouraged students to make reading a regular habit and proudly appreciated the students representing the school in the Student Exchange Programme to South Korea, inspiring everyone to work hard, dream big, and make the most of every opportunity.

As part of the **CBSE activity**, students enthusiastically participated in the “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” campaign by planting saplings to promote environmental awareness and express their love and gratitude towards their mothers. The activity encouraged students towards nature and contributed to a greener future.

Theme Assembly - "Nature and Me" was a wonderful celebration of learning, where the children confidently showcased their knowledge through engaging presentations. They spoke about body parts, sense organs, emotions, and the importance of caring for nature. The assembly also included a meaningful pledge to keep our Earth clean, followed by a vibrant group dance that added joy to the event.

The assembly provided children with a valuable platform to express themselves, build confidence, and strengthen their communication and collaborative skills. It also helped develop their fine motor skills, imagination, and appreciation for natural materials, making learning both fun and meaningful.

Bagless Day - Bagless Day provided children with an opportunity to learn beyond textbooks through interactive and activity-based experiences. Each subject was planned with fun and engaging tasks that helped develop creativity, confidence, and practical understanding. **In Math**, Birds with Circles: Children enjoyed a fun art activity by creating colourful birds using different-sized circle shapes. This hands-on craft helped them recognise shapes, improve fine motor skills, and express their creativity. The activity made learning joyful as children explored colours, shapes, and imagination through art. **In English** - children explored letters through a fun and creative literacy activity. Big petals with different alphabets were pasted on a hoopla, and each child drew an object beginning with the assigned letter. They then painted and coloured their drawings using brushes and paints. The joy and excitement on their faces as they freely painted and expressed their creativity made the learning experience truly memorable. **In EVS Activity:** children enjoyed a colourful leaf printing activity. They painted leaves with different colours and gently pressed them onto a white sheet to create beautiful leaf impressions. The children were thrilled to see the vibrant prints and learned about the unique shapes and patterns found in nature through this fun hands-on activity.
