They also participated in various concept-based activities to reinforce their learning. Along with this, students learned the pre-concept of 'in' and 'out' through engaging hands-on activities that helped them understand spatial awareness in a fun way. They practiced writing and recapped the letters L, T, and I, as well as the number 1 in their notebooks, which supported the development of their early writing and number skills.

After the summer break, The **Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM)** was held to provide a wonderful opportunity for parents and teachers to reconnect and discuss the holistic development of the students. Parents were informed about the curriculum, classroom expectations, and the exciting learning experiences planned for the new term.
