In **Numeracy**, they developed a stronger understanding of the concept of **tens and ones (1–70)** and reinforced their knowledge of **missing numbers, before, after, and between** through a variety of interactive, activity-based exercises. They also practised **backward counting from 30 to 0**, which helped enhance their number sense, sequencing skills, and confidence in counting. These engaging learning experiences made mathematical concepts easy to understand while encouraging active participation and joyful learning.

Under the theme '**Plants**', students enthusiastically explored the amazing world of plants through engaging activities. They learnt about seed germination, the different parts of a plant and their functions, various types of plants, their importance in our daily lives, and the basic process of photosynthesis. The concept of plant parts was introduced through a cheerful rhyme, making learning enjoyable and easy to remember.

Learning was further reinforced through a range of interactive and experiential activities. Students explored different varieties of seeds by comparing their size, shape, and texture. Nature walks provided opportunities to observe plants in the environment and recognise their similarities and differences. 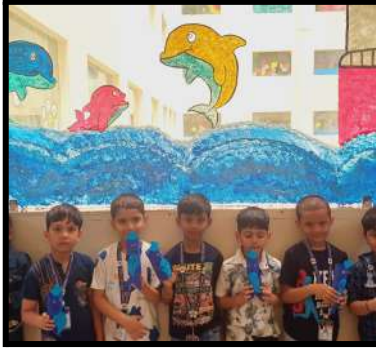
