Good evening to all present here on this wintery evening. I extend a very warm welcome to our distinguished guests, dignitaries, parents, school faculty members and students to the school's 3rd Annual Function. This day is not just about celebrations and festivities. It is a day of reflection, a day when we celebrate the achievements of our students and reflect on what we have achieved in the past year.

Let me take you back to the last time I met you on this dias...the **Annual Day** of 2022- 23 where we presented the magnificent play- Aasim, the Mighty Protector. This play was written keeping in the mind the theme of good over evil, where we showcased that however long it takes, good always has victory over evil. The production was an astounding success as we had nearly 100% participation of students and the ground was set to accommodate the proud and enthusiastic parents. An Annual Day event is the culmination of a lot of hard work of the teachers, students and support staff and it takes a lot of planning, effort and dedication to put the act together. Ofcourse, this wouldn't have been possible without your support.

The year 2023 commenced with the first off line **Graduation ceremony of Kindergarten** students in February where they proudly donned on their blue gowns and black caps and received their certificates in front of the equally proud parents. This ceremony was very personal for me as I have admitted each and every child and I have a personal connect with each parent and each child.

The highlight of session 2022- 23 was our first batch of Grade X who appeared for **the Board Examinations**. This was the pandemic batch, the ones who lost two years in online studies and the one which had to put in double the effort. Keeping in mind the effect the pandemic had on the students, it is with great pride that I announce that we had a 100% pass percentage, with the highest scorers being above 90%. The teachers and students worked very hard and left no stone unturned to get us this stupendous result.

2022 ended on a positive note as our students participated in World Robot Olympiad- India which is India's largest Robotics competition for school students in the Young Innovator- Elementary category and secured II position. The team comprised of students of Grade VI- Aashi Ojha , Jasmin Kaur and Aditya Thanvi.

The session of 2023- 24 commenced with the **Orientation programmes** which were planned systematically to ensure that the new parents are all aligned with our methodologies and were aware of what was planned in the annual calendar. The sessions were interactive where parents got an opportunity to clarify any doubts that they had or required further information on the approach that the school has. The sessions also gave clarity to parents on the salient features of the National Education Policy, which aims to increase the focus on strengthening teacher training, reforming the existing exam system, early childhood care and restructuring the regulatory framework of education.

The pandemic had caused a gap in the annual calendar and finally in July we hosted our **second Proficiency Ceremony** where 58 students across Toddlers to Grade IX were recognized for their efforts.

The student council is a platform where students are conferred with responsibilities and they get a chance to be role models for others. 21 proud badge holders were sworn in as the Student Council for this session in the 3rd **Investiture Ceremony** in August.

This year we hosted our in school 3rd Interschool Event- **MAADHYAM**. The theme was Over the Ages and the focus was to recognize this change over the ages and to dwell deeper on the advantages and disadvantages. The carefully crafted events gave the participants an opportunity to research and be in awe of the changes over many millennia and to assess these changes. It was a mega success as we had over 25 schools that participated, with over 200 participants. Keeping with the true spirit of being fair, Imperial Heritage School only participated and was not judged.

At IHS we strongly believe in inculcating values and honing skills and while we plan our annual calendar, we incorporate **special weeks** keeping the same in mind. During the year we have celebrated several special weeks to draw attention to various skills and values that are interestingly aligned with a few Sustainable Development Goals. Some of the weeks were Environment Week, Book Week, Heritage Week, Week of Sharing and Caring, to name a few.

A school assembly is one of the most important aspects of a school's curriculum. It makes a positive contribution to students' self-development and encourages them to reflect upon a set of universal values, such as love, peace, truth, co-operation and respect. **Special Assemblies** were held during the course of the year where students got an opportunity to showcase the importance of important topics like Environment, Books, Indian Heritage, Raksha Bandhan, Haryana Day, Janam Ashtami, Sanskrit Diwas, Gandhi Jayanti, Dusshera and Diwali, to name a few.

We also celebrated **special days, international and national days** to honour some noteworthy Indians and acknowledge the importance of some aspects of society. These help to promote awareness and create a sense of identity, patriotism, community, and accountability. This year

we proudly celebrated Jallianwala Bagh, Heritage Day, Hiroshima Day, World Day for Safety and Health of Workers, International Labour Day, World Environment Day, International Yoga Day, Constitution Day, to name a few.

Parents and grandparents are the steadfast pillars of a child's life and here at IHS we ensure that they get an opportunity to spend time together at school. Celebration of **Mother's Day and Father's Day** was done by Pre Primary to Grade II students.

It is said that parents know a lot, but grandparents know everything. To celebrate the lovely bond, Pre Primary students celebrated **Grandparents** Day and hosted UTSAV- a grand celebration for them. This year the theme was Ramayana, the same epic that is narrated by each grandparent to their little ones was showcased back to them.

"Children are born learners who need a supportive environment to bring out their natural talents", a quote by Maria Montessori clearly spells out that the focus of a school is on developing a student's mind from all sides. This includes the physical, intellectual, cognitive, emotional and social development and other skills such as persuasion, collaboration and problem-solving. To help hone these skills, **intra class and inter house competitions** were carefully planned and were made a part of the annual calendar.

This year we also hosted our first **In- House Model United Nations Conference** where students across Grades IV- XI participated. The conference was hosted by the school's Head Boy, Eshaan Vikram Singh and Head Girl Hanshika Jindal. Considering that it was IHS's first MUN, there were two committees- UNGA (United Nations General Assembly) and UNHRC (United Nations Human Rights Council).

Students also got an opportunity to participate in an MUM Conference hosted by Blue Bells School. All the participating delegates proved themselves during the GSL round and Jhalak Rana of Grade VIII was lauded for the Best speaker and received the Appreciation certificate.

Continuing with the global outlook, IHS has a robust **Virtual Exchange Programme**, where our students interact with students of other countries and exchange ideas and information.

Opportunities like MUN and Student Exchange Programmes are platforms that give students an opportunity to explore the boundaries of their school and country and to get a chance to research and understand the culture, heritage and political strategies of other countries. Both these programmes in our school are led by our SST teacher, Ms. Gunjan Dudeja, who has immense experience in conducting these and her passion and dedication is evident in each session that she gets conducted.
