The birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel on October 31st, is celebrated as Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) in India. To commemorate the day, the school organised **Run for unity** on 29th October. Students of all grades participated enthusiastically in the event.

To educate the students on safe road usage to prevent accidents, injuries, and fatalities by promoting responsible behavior like obeying traffic laws, using seatbelts and helmets, and avoiding distractions, **Road Safety Awareness** workshop was conducted on 30th November by Gurugram Police.

The students of Grade XI Humanities attended a counselling session conducted by the school counsellor, Ms. Divya Chhabra, focusing on **POCSO awareness**. The session aimed to educate students about their rights and safety under the **Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act**. 
