Students across all grades were busy with their regular practice sessions for the event and teachers were working equally hard to make this event a grand success. From dance performances to play and musical events, to speeches, the school’s Annual Day practice is filled with the most treasured moments- the dress rehearsals, run throughs and the uncontrollable enthusiasm. It is a once-a-year event that brings out teachers, students, school management and parents on the same platform to enjoy the celebrations.

✦ Special Days & Celebrations

Children’s Day: Children’s Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm and joy. Teachers organized various subject-based activities that combined fun with learning. Students participated actively and enjoyed every moment of the celebration. The day highlighted the spirit of childhood and created cheerful memories for everyone.

Subject Highlights –

English – Students studied “*Tytyl’s Adventure*” and “*The Cow*”, learning about kindness, gratitude, and appreciation for simple joys. They understood the moral values and improved their reading skills.

In Grammar students learned about prepositions through fun activities and also practiced opposite words and the use of the apostrophe. They understood basic grammar rules and used them correctly in sentences.

Math – Students learned addition and subtraction through a fun activity called “*Feed the Monster*,” which helped them practice basic operations playfully. They also explored fractions using colourful flashcards, making the concept easy and engaging to understand. Students improved their calculation skills and developed a clear understanding of fractions through hands-on learning. Students learned about time by making their own wristwatches. They also talked a few lines about them, which helped them understand how to tell time.

EVS –In EVS, students learned about the universe and the solar system. They enjoyed a fun hands-on activity using a globe and torch to understand the concepts of rotation and revolution. Students gained a clear understanding of how day and night occur and how the Earth moves around the Sun. Students also learned about the different phases of the Moon. They enjoyed a creative activity where they pasted the shapes of the Moon’s phases, helping them understand how the Moon appears to change shape over a month.

Value of the Month –Honesty –

Students participated in an activity called “*The Lost-and-Found Box*,” where they found small classroom items placed around the room and discussed what they would do with them. Through this activity, they learned the importance of honesty and doing the right thing in everyday situations.



