To make the learning experience more creative, students crafted a **thermometer model** to represent different adverbs of degree. They also drew an **illustration of their choice** and filled it with the sorted adverbs, allowing them to express both their understanding and artistic skills.

The activity proved to be **highly interactive and enjoyable**. It not only helped assess the students' knowledge of adverbs but also **enhanced their creativity, reasoning, and ability to organize information**. Overall, the session was a meaningful blend of learning and fun.

Each child set up a small market stall, selected items to 'sell,' and calculated the cost price, selling price, profit or loss, and the profit or loss percentage. Through this engaging experience, students not only strengthened their understanding of profit and loss but also learned how percentages are applied in real-life situations. The classroom transformed into a lively marketplace, helping students connect mathematical concepts with practical use while boosting their confidence, communication skills, and logical thinking. The students thoroughly enjoyed the activity and showcased great enthusiasm and creativity throughout.

In **Science**, students observed the models of the human brain, human eye and other sense organs to understand their various parts and functions. They also prepared the topic and did flip learning and teaching in the class for better understanding of the topic.

This hands-on task not only enriched their knowledge but also encouraged teamwork, creativity and clarity in understanding historical sequences.
