Here is a look at what transpired in November:

Value of the Month:-The value of the month was Honesty. To help students understand its importance, teachers engaged them in meaningful discussions on how honesty builds trust and strengthens relationships. After an intense football match, teachers guided students to accept the outcome with honesty and sportsmanship, emphasizing that true victory lies in integrity, fair play, and learning from every experience.

Run For Unity - On October 28th 2024, Imperial Heritage School, proudly hosted the CBSE Unity Run, an inspiring event organized in honour of the upcoming National Unity Day on October 28th . The initiative, aimed at fostering unity and harmony among young minds, saw enthusiastic participation from students, staff, and faculty. Participants wore ‘Run for Unity’ badges and carried banners promoting peace, diversity, and mutual respect as they jogged through the school premises, embodying the true spirit of togetherness and national pride.

Road Safety Workshop: In collaboration with the Gurugram Police, IHS organized an engaging Road Safety Programme to create awareness among students. Officers interacted with learners, demonstrating safe road practices, traffic rules, and the importance of responsible behaviour. Through videos, demonstrations, and discussions, students learned essential safety measures. The session strengthened awareness and encouraged children to become responsible and alert road users.

World Immunization Day: Immunization is a cornerstone of healthcare and a fundamental human right. World Immunization Day, observed each year on November 10th, serves to highlight the significance of vaccination in safeguarding public health. To commemorate the day, students of Grade VII engaged in an immunization card-making activity and explored the crucial role vaccines play in preventing disease. Through creative posters, thoughtful discussions, and informative presentations, they learned how vaccines work, their contribution to eradicating illnesses, and the importance of widespread immunization. The activity reinforced the message that vaccines are essential in protecting both individuals and entire communities.

“Vande Mataram Concert”- Our National Song "Vande Mataram", composed by Shri Bankim Chandra Chatterjee, is believed to have been written on Akshaya Navami, which fell on 7th November 1875. First published in the literary journal Bangadarshan as part of his novel Anandamath and later independently in 1882, the song beautifully personifies the Motherland as a symbol of strength, prosperity, and divinity, inspiring India's spirit of unity and national pride. In order to commemorate 150 years of Vande Mataram the students of IHS actively participated in "Vande Mataram Concerts" on 7th November 2025. This effort served as an expression of collective harmony and national pride, celebrating the strength of our unity in diversity.

Children's Day: Children's Day is observed on November 14th, the birthday of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who believed in the importance of nurturing children to shape a better future. IHS celebrated this special day to honor and promote the well-being and education of children through a bagless day with various activities that encouraged creativity, fun, and learning.

Birsa Munda's Vision for Tribal Welfare: Birsa Munda's birth anniversary, observed on November 15th, honors the remarkable life and legacy of one of India's most respected tribal freedom fighters and social reformers. A visionary leader from Jharkhand, he is celebrated for his deep bond with nature, his spiritual strength, and his unwavering dedication to building a just and equitable society for tribal communities. Revered as "*Dharti Aba*" (Father of the Earth) by the Munda tribe, Birsa Munda remains a powerful symbol of tribal identity, resilience, and pride. At IHS, his birth anniversary was commemorated on November 14th through a poster-making activity and student presentations that highlighted his significant contributions to India's freedom movement and his tireless efforts to uplift tribal communities. The activity enabled students to understand and appreciate his enduring legacy and the values he championed.

CBSE – Janjatiya Diwas Activities: As part of the Janjatiya Diwas celebrations, a series of engaging activities were organized to help students learn about and appreciate India's rich tribal heritage.

- **10th November:** Students participated in a role-play activity based on the life stories of notable tribal achievers. Through these performances, they explored the inspiring journeys, contributions, and cultural significance of various tribal icons.
- **13th November:** A *Community Bhoj* was organized, featuring a menu that included at least one traditional tribal recipe. This gathering offered students an opportunity to experience the flavors of tribal cuisine and understand the cultural value of shared meals within tribal communities. These activities collectively promoted awareness, respect, and pride in India's diverse tribal traditions.

Subject Enrichment Activities: In Science , students explored the different modes of respiration in unicellular and multicellular organisms. They also gained a detailed understanding of the anatomy and functioning of the human respiratory system. They also learnt transportation of substances in human beings using physical model of Human Torso. To enhance the understanding of how substances are transported in plants, students explored the concepts of osmosis and diffusion through a simple hands-on experiment using a potato osmometer. Salt and sugar hypertonic solutions were used to demonstrate the movement of water molecules and its effects on plant tissues. **In SST** , our creative young minds of Grade VII stepped into the world of advertising with great









