**Greetings from Imperial Heritage School!**

This month, our students actively participated in a range of engaging activities and competitions that filled their days with joy and meaningful learning.

**Run For Unity** - On 28th October 2024, Imperial Heritage School, proudly hosted the CBSE Unity Run, an inspiring event organized in honour of the upcoming National Unity Day on 31st October. The initiative, aimed at fostering unity and harmony among young minds, saw enthusiastic participation from students, staff, and faculty. Participants wore ‘Run for Unity’ badges and carried banners promoting peace, diversity, and mutual respect as they jogged through the school premises, embodying the true spirit of togetherness and national pride.

**World Immunization Day:** To mark World Immunization Day, students created Vaccination Cards, learning about the importance of timely immunization in protecting individuals and communities from preventable diseases. Through this activity, they understood key vaccines, the purpose of booster doses, and the role of immunization in building a healthier society.

**Birsa Munda’s Birth Anniversary:** On the occasion of Birsa Munda’s Birth Anniversary, students honoured the great tribal freedom fighter by making creative posters highlighting his bravery, leadership, and vision. They also presented speeches and participated in role plays on the life of tribal communities, focusing on their culture, struggles, traditions, and close relationship with nature. These activities were a part of CBSE’s **Janjatiya Gaurav Pakhwara** and encouraged students to appreciate the contribution of tribal communities in India’s history and to value diversity and equality.

**CBSE Activity:** As per CBSE guidelines an Hindi essay-writing activity on Rural India was conducted in the class. This activity helped students deepen their understanding of village life, its challenges, and its strengths. They learned to think critically, express ideas clearly, and appreciate the importance of rural development for the nation’s progress.

**Children’s Day Celebrations:** To celebrate Children’s Day, students participated in a subject-related engaging activity designed to ease them and break the monotony of regular textbook learning. The activity encouraged creativity, critical thinking and joyful participation, allowing learners to explore concepts in an enjoyable and interactive way. After the academic activity, the celebration continued with a lively musical chair game, followed by an energetic music and dance session. In **Hindi**, a group activity was conducted based on the chapter "Paani ki kahani", students were divided into groups to create a diagram of the water cycle, beautifully illustrating processes like evaporation, condensation, rainfall, and collection using colours and chart paper.

**Value of the month:** As part of the Value of the Month – **Honesty**, students participated in an **Honesty Web Word Activity**, where the central theme was *Honesty*—one of the most essential qualities for character building.
