**Dear Parents,
Greetings!!**

December is the last month of the year and brings a joyful and festive atmosphere. The weather becomes cooler, and children enjoy the pleasant winter season. It is a time filled with celebrations, holidays, and moments of togetherness. In school, children take part in Annual Day, winter activities, creative crafts, and fun learning experiences. December also encourages feelings of kindness, sharing, and reflection as we prepare to welcome a new year with hope and happiness.

November was a lively and enriching month for the children. It was filled with learning, fun, and memorable experiences. The month included the joyful celebration of Children’s Day, where students enjoyed a special Bagless Day with music, games, stories, and many exciting activities. Along with this, children participated in various classroom and creative activities that helped them learn new concepts in an enjoyable way. The practice for the Annual Day also took place throughout the month, adding excitement and enthusiasm as the children prepared their performances. Overall, November was a wonderful blend of fun and learning, making it a truly delightful and productive month for the students.

In Literacy class, children learned the letters **Tt, Uu, and Vv** along with their sounds. They practiced recognizing the letters, saying their sounds, writing them, and learning the correct letter formation. Children also identified words that begin with these letters. To make learning engaging, a correlated activity was conducted where students enjoyed hands-on tasks such as tracing, writing practice, picture–sound matching, and sorting objects related to each letter. These activities helped reinforce phonics, vocabulary, and proper letter formation in a fun and interactive way.

In Numeracy, children learned the numbers **35 to 45** and understood how to break each number into **Tens and Ones**. They practiced counting objects, grouping them into tens, and identifying how many ones are left. Through activities and worksheets, they understood that numbers from 35 to 45 have **3 tens** and **4 tens** the remaining value in **ones**. Children explored the concept of **Tall and Short** by observing and comparing different objects. They looked at pictures, classroom items, and real-life examples to see which object is taller and which one is shorter. This helped them understand size differences in a fun and practical way.

Children revised all the basic shapes that were taught earlier. They identified shapes like circle, square, triangle, and rectangle through different activities. They also practiced recognizing shapes in their surroundings and enjoyed hands-on tasks like drawing, sorting, and matching shapes.

In EVS children were introduced to the theme “Seasons.” They learned that the weather keeps changing throughout the year, and these changes create different types of seasons such as summer, winter, monsoon, and spring. They also discussed how each season has its own weather pattern—for example, summers are hot, winters are cold, and monsoon brings rain. The class also explored how our food habits change in each season. Children learned that we eat cool and refreshing foods in summer, warm soups and hot drinks in winter, and fresh fruits and vegetables in other seasons. In addition, children talked about how our clothes change with the weather—light cotton clothes in summer, woollen clothes in winter, and raincoats and umbrellas during the rainy season. To make learning fun, the children participated in many activities such as sorting seasonal clothes and foods, matching weather pictures, and sharing their own experiences of different seasons.

Children’s Day was celebrated with great joy as a *Bagless Day*. Students came without books and enjoyed a variety of fun-filled activities such as music and dance, indoor games, team activities, storytelling, and fun classroom games. They also received special treats and surprises.

The day was full of laughter and excitement, giving children a memorable and delightful celebration. Children also learned **why we celebrate Children’s Day**—it is observed on the birthday of **our first Prime Minister, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru**, who loved children and believed they are the future of the nation.

My Pink Car Craft – Children enjoyed making a beautiful *Pink Car Craft*. This activity helped them enhance their fine motor skills, creativity, and imagination as they coloured, cut, and assembled their own little cars.

World Kindness Day – On World Kindness Day, students participated in discussions and small acts of kindness. They learned the importance of sharing, helping others, using polite words, and showing care and respect. The day encouraged them to be kind in their everyday actions.

Four Seasons Sorting Activity – Theme Craft- In this activity, children sorted pictures related to the four seasons—summer, winter, rainy, and spring. They identified the correct season for each item, helping them understand weather changes, clothing, and seasonal differences in a fun and interactive way.

Value for the Month Honesty means **telling the truth, speaking what is right, and not hiding or lying** about anything. It also means **being fair, following rules, and doing the right thing even when no one is watching**. We encourage children to be honest with their parents, teachers, and friends so that everyone can trust them. Honesty helps children build good character and strong relationships.
