**Dear Parents,
Greetings!**

As the year draws to a close, December gently invites us to pause and celebrate the journey we've traveled. It's a time brimming with warmth, gratitude, and fresh possibilities. Against cozy scenes of winter gatherings and holiday cheer, we're reminded of meaningful moments with loved ones. It's a season to honour our progress, cherish where we are now, and anticipate the new adventures that await.

In **Literacy**, the focus was on the "o" vowel family words (such as *ot, ob, op, og*) while also revisiting the "a" and "e" vowel family groups. To build vocabulary, students learned new sight words and practised forming short sentences with them. The concept of **this** and **that** were introduced via interactive activities that encouraged students to distinguish and use them correctly. Learning was made fun and dynamic by incorporating online tools such as "Spin the Wheel," "Word Wall," and quizzes- giving students a multimedia way to engage with their lessons.

In **Numeracy**, students explored and reinforced the fundamentals of numbers 1 to 8 by learning their number names. They practiced counting aloud together from 1 to 100, and worked on identifying which numbers come **before**, **after**, and **in between** within that range. The concept of skip-counting by 2's was introduced through engaging hands-on activities, helping them recognise number patterns. To support their addition skills, we used real objects to introduce picture addition- making abstract ideas concrete.

In **EVS**, students delved into the engaging topic of "*Seasons*." They explored the unique characteristics of two seasons—*spring* and *summer*—learning about the foods people enjoy, the clothes we wear, and the weather and climate typical of each. A vibrant *bulletin-board display* helped them gain a clear visual understanding of the concept. As part of a *hands-on theme-based craft activity*, students drew and coloured various elements related to the seasons.. This creative exercise not only enhanced their artistic expression but also deepened their understanding of how each season brings its own beauty and charm.

This month was all about Pink — a bright, cheerful colour that encourages thoughts of love, kindness and happiness. The children looked adorable dressed head-to-toe in pink and created delightful pink flamingo crafts to celebrate the theme. They also enjoyed talking about all the pink items they could spot in class and at home, bringing the colour to life in fun, meaningful ways.

On the occasion of *World Kindness Day*, students celebrated the spirit of kindness through engaging and meaningful activities. They reflected on the importance of being kind, empathetic, and caring towards others, and discussed how these values can be practiced in everyday life. As part of the celebration, the children created a *Jar of Kindness*, writing kind words, positive messages, and examples of kind acts on small chits, which they placed in the jar. They also made a beautiful *Kindness Tree* by writing kind words and messages on heart-shaped cutouts and pasting them on the tree. These activities encouraged students to appreciate the power of small acts of kindness and helped them understand how kindness can brighten the lives of others and make the world a better place.

Commemorating the birth anniversary of *Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru*, fondly known as “Chacha Nehru,” the school joyously celebrated *Children’s Day* alongside *Bagless Day*, creating a vibrant blend of learning, laughter, and togetherness. The day was thoughtfully designed to honour the spirit of childhood and to encourage joyful, experience-based learning beyond the classroom. The celebration began with an engaging *storytelling session*, where teachers narrated heartwarming tale that captivated the children’s imagination. The excitement soared as teachers surprised students with a lively *dance performance*, filling the atmosphere with cheer and affection. Students enthusiastically participated in fun-filled *classroom games* which fostered teamwork and joyful energy. Adding a creative twist, a *tattoo-making session* conducted by the teachers brought colour and smiles to every face. The combined celebration of *Children’s Day* and *Bagless Day* was a memorable tribute to the innocence, curiosity, and boundless enthusiasm of childhood - a day filled with laughter, love, and learning in its happiest form.

A *Hindi Handwriting Competition* was conducted to encourage students to develop neat, legible, and well-formed handwriting while fostering love and respect for the Hindi language. Students participated with great enthusiasm, carefully writing each letter with attention to detail and presentation. The activity helped them understand the importance of good handwriting as a reflection of discipline and clarity of thought. 
🏠 IHS News –


