Dear Parents,

February is a month of learning and growth, offering opportunities to set new goals and make each day meaningful. Though short, it inspires us to balance academics, creativity, and kindness while moving closer to the end of the school year.

The students of Grade I presented a beautifully combined **Special Assembly on Basant Panchami and Republic Day**. The assembly reflected the spirit of both occasions—celebrating the wisdom and learning symbolised by Goddess Saraswati, and the pride, unity, and democratic values enshrined in the Indian Constitution. Through confident speeches, melodious prayers, vibrant dances, and meaningful messages, the young learners showcased their understanding of India’s rich cultural heritage and the importance of being responsible citizens. Dressed in hues of yellow and the tricolour, the children filled the atmosphere with positivity, patriotism, and festive joy. The assembly was a delightful blend of tradition and national pride, leaving everyone inspired by the enthusiasm, innocence, and sincerity of our Grade I students.

The students also honored the **unsung heroes of our nation**—those who contributed greatly but are less recognized—through an **Intra-Class Fancy Dress Competition**. Dressed as these heroes, the children dressed well highlighting their bravery, kindness, and sacrifices.

In **Math**, comparing and grouping are essential skills that help young learners understand the world around them by observing similarities and differences and sorting objects into sets based on common features. Through the activity *Comparing Two Different Objects in the Classroom*, students examined pairs of objects to identify what made them alike and what set them apart, thereby strengthening their observation and logical thinking. Alongside these skills, students were introduced to the concept of division as a way of sharing or splitting objects into equal parts. Practical exercises, such as dividing pencils among friends or sharing counters equally, helped them grasp the idea of fair distribution, laying a strong foundation for future problem-solving and mathematical understanding.

In **EVS**, the concepts of **Transport and Communication** play a vital role in helping us move around and stay connected. To explore these ideas, students drew their favourite vehicles and described their features, combining creativity with learning about different modes of transport. They also engaged in a hands-on activity, making String Phones with cups and string, which demonstrated how sound travels through a medium. These activities not only deepened their understanding of transport and communication but also encouraged creativity, curiosity, and interactive learning.

In **English**, children enjoyed the chapter about the **red raincoat**, especially its lively illustrations that brought the story to life. Alongside the reading, the use of **will** for future actions and **was** for past events was introduced. They learned conjunctions **AND** and **OR**, making grammar learning engaging and connected to the story.

In accordance with guidelines issued by CBSE, students participated in the **Road Safety Awareness Initiative**. As part of the programme, students were sensitised about road safety norms, traffic rules, and responsible behaviour as pedestrians and commuters. The students solemnly took the Road Safety Pledge, reaffirming their

commitment to follow traffic rules and promote road safety awareness in their daily lives. The initiative aimed at developing a sense of civic responsibility and ensuring the safety and well-being of all road users, in line with CBSE’s emphasis on creating socially responsible citizens.

Respect was the **value for the month**. Students made a Poster on Respect Our Nation. To dive into the patriotic fervor students created a poster to show their respect for our country. Respecting and honouring our nation is very important and students learnt about this value through videos, discussions and art work.




