Through this pledge, students reflected on fearless thinking, moral strength, and responsible citizenship, reinforcing their role as conscientious and compassionate future leaders of the nation.

To commemorate **Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti**, the students of grade XI Humanities presented a well-researched paper analyzing the political relationship between Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and Adolf Hitler, critically examining diplomatic strategies within the historical context of World War II and Netaji's unwavering objective of India's independence. This activity enhanced historical understanding, critical thinking, creativity, and value-based learning while fostering respect for India's freedom struggle and inspiring responsible citizenship.

Under CBSE activity a **Road Safety Mass Pledge** was conducted in the school premises to create awareness about safe road practices among students and staff. During the pledge, everyone committed to following traffic rules, wearing safety gear, avoiding distractions while walking or driving, and respecting pedestrians. The programme aimed to instill a sense of responsibility and discipline on the roads, helping students understand their role in preventing accidents and ensuring safety for all.

**Assessment of Speaking and Listening Skills** was conducted as a part of the **English** subject enrichment activity to assess their proficiency level in the language with the objective that they are able to interpret what is being said and are able to express themselves well.

**National Girl Child Day** was observed in the school to create awareness about the importance of the girl child and promote gender equality among students. The students of grade XI Humanities wrote a life sketch of female bureaucrats of India, inspiring them through examples of leadership, determination, and service.

**Republic Day**- India celebrates **Republic Day on 26 January** to commemorate the adoption and enforcement of the Indian Constitution in **1950**, marking the nation's transformation into a **sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic** governed by its own laws, replacing the British-era Government of India Act. The day upholds the constitutional values of **justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity**, empowering citizens to choose their own government. Unlike **Independence Day (15 August)**, which marks freedom from British rule, Republic Day celebrates the establishment of India's constitutional democracy. To mark this occasion, **Grade 1 students presented a special assembly** that beautifully instilled feelings of **patriotism and national pride** through melodious songs, a meaningful skit, and vibrant dance performances. The assembly began with the **Principal's flag hoisting**, followed by the **National Anthem**, setting a solemn and inspiring tone for the celebration.

The assembly highlighted the importance of Basant Panchami as a festival that marks the arrival of spring and honours Goddess Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom. 
**Final Term Examination** are approaching and February month plays a pivotal role in consolidating the preparations and focusing on revision. We wish our students best of luck for their future endeavours.



The value of the month '**Respect**' was inculcated by the mutual discussion that how we should respect our elders and all community members that we see around us.
