January began with students returning refreshed from the winter break. It was time to reconnect with routines, refocus on learning, and gear up for an engaging classroom journey filled with curiosity, creativity, and collaboration.

### ✨ **Special Days & Celebrations**

January was marked with vibrant celebrations and meaningful observances. A **Special Assembly on Republic Day and Basant Panchami** was confidently conducted by **Grade I A and B**, where students showcased cultural values, teamwork, and expression.

**Republic Day celebrations** emphasized the importance of activities and competitions in building confidence, leadership, and national pride among students. As part of the celebration, students created **Tricolour Food Art**, which they joyfully shared with their friends, fostering unity and togetherness. An **Intra-Class Competition titled “Tales of Freedom”** was conducted, where students spoke about freedom fighters through poems and stories in their own creative way.

### **Subject Highlights –**

**English:** The month began with the prose chapter “**Travelling to Assam,**” where students created their own travel logs, encouraging imagination, sequencing of ideas, and expressive writing.

This was followed by the poem “**The Kite,**” which students enthusiastically recited while enhancing their vocabulary through guided discussions.

**Mathematics:** As part of the topic **Measurement**, students explored the concept of mass through a hands-on group activity. They created a simple **weight machine**, weighed different objects, and recorded their observations collectively, making learning interactive and practical.

In the chapter “**Capacity – Which One You Need?**”, students measured and recorded the amount of water their bottles could hold, helping them connect mathematical concepts to real-life situations.

In **Data Handling**, students made a **pictograph** of their favourite ice cream flavours. They coloured and pasted their chosen ice cream under the correct flavour, which enhanced their understanding of data representation in a fun and engaging way.

**EVS:** Under the topic Directions, students went outdoors and enjoyed understanding the four directions through a practical experience of using a compass in the playground. They then reinforced their learning by making a compass in their notebooks, making the activity experiential and engaging.

In the chapter “Transport and Communication,” students enhanced their understanding by making walkie-talkies and enjoyed communicating with their peers, which strengthened conceptual clarity through play-based learning.

### ☀ Value of the Month – Respect

The **Value of the Month** was “**Respect.**” Students participated in an engaging activity titled “**Ways to Show Respect,**” where they shared and presented their views on how they respect themselves, their peers, elders, teachers, and their surroundings. This activity helped students reflect on positive behaviour, empathy, and responsible citizenship.



their parents. This celebration aims to strengthen the bond between students and their families while making the day joyful and memorable for everyone.





