The activity helped students understand that road safety is everyone's responsibility and reminded them to be careful, disciplined, and responsible citizens in their everyday lives.

In **English**, related to the chapter 'CONJUNCTIONS', students scanned newspapers and magazines to spot conjunctions such as **and, or, but, and because**. They underlined these words, cut out the sentences, and pasted them neatly in their notebooks. This hands-on activity helped students understand how conjunctions connect ideas and are used in real-life writing. Additionally, students performed a role play based on the chapter **The Mouse Maiden**. They confidently enacted the characters, using expressions, dialogues, and gestures to bring the story to life. The activity helped enhance their speaking skills, creativity, and understanding of the story. Alongside this, they revised grammar topics through various fun activities and quizzes, reinforcing their understanding in an interactive way. The combined activities helped enhance their speaking skills, creativity, and language learning.

In **EVS**, Students enjoyed a fun EVS activity on transport and travel. They first created a timeline of transport, showing how travel evolved from bullock carts and boats to bicycles, cars, trains, and airplanes. In the next activity, they made a vacation travel chart, pasting pictures of places they visited and the means of transport they used. These activities helped students understand the history of transport and relate it to their own travel experiences. The hands-on approach encouraged creativity, teamwork, and practical learning. In another chapter on Communication, they enacted a mime where they told a story without using words, and in another activity, students brought models of different modes of communication. In the Pottery chapter, students observed

different things that are made of clay in their home and made a list of them, and then they made a shape of their own choice with clay in the pottery period.

In the **Math** class, in the Time chapter children made a wrist watch using a paper cup and drew a time of their own choice, followed by asking their partner to tell what time it was? In the Money chapter, they made a budget for their birthday party, and in another activity, they made a piggy bank with the waste material.

As part of the **Value of the Month: Respect**, students wrote their ideas on how they can show respect for **nature, friends, family, and the nation** on sticky notes and pasted them on the board. The teacher also discussed the importance of respect and showed a short video to reinforce the concept. This activity encouraged reflection, creativity, and a deeper understanding of respect in everyday life.



3. General Information
