Each student spoke a short paragraph explaining the chosen story or teaching and shared the values they learned from it. The activity helped build confidence, encouraged expressive speaking, and reinforced values like self-belief, discipline, and service, while deepening students’ appreciation of India’s cultural and spiritual heritage.

As part of the celebrations of **Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti**, students actively participated in a creative and value-based activity. The students designed a new INA cap while retaining its original shape and experimenting with different colour combinations. Through this activity, they explored the symbolism of colours and connected them with values such as courage, unity, sacrifice, and patriotism associated with Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and the Indian National Army.

On the occasion of **National Girl Child Day**, a Quote Reflection Circle activity was successfully conducted for students during the SST period on 22nd January. The activity was organised to sensitise students towards the importance of the girl child, focusing on themes such as education, equality, rights, and empowerment. Students participated in a round-table discussion where meaningful quotes related to the girl child were read aloud. Each student confidently shared their understanding of the quote they had brought, explaining its meaning and why it was important to them. The reflections showed empathy, awareness, and thoughtful perspectives on gender equality and the role of girls in society.

The activity encouraged active listening, respectful sharing of ideas, and self-expression. It also helped build confidence and fostered a supportive environment where students learned to appreciate diverse viewpoints.



3. General Information
