Let us welcome the months of February and March—months that often bring lasting change and renewed momentum. These months offer much to look forward to and little to regret, as life gradually picks up pace and purpose.

January was filled with excitement, marked by extended winter vacations, engaging activities, and new challenges. The month also witnessed a range of significant celebrations such as National Youth Day, Netaji Subhash Chandra Jayanti, National Girl Child Day, and Republic Day.

The PTM was successfully conducted and parents were apprised of their ward’s academic progress through the unit test results. The students were also given the term end exams datesheet, signalling the onset of assessment and graduation to the next class.

As we move ahead, the focus during this period will be on completing the planned syllabus in preparation for the Final Examination.

National Youth Day- Students of Grades VII participated in an SST activity to observe National Youth Day, commemorating the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. During the SST period, students designed and creatively decorated bookmarks featuring inspiring quotes by Swami Vivekananda. Through this activity, students reflected on his ideals of courage, conscience, compassion, fearless thinking, discipline, and selfless service. The activity successfully encouraged creativity, promoted reading habits, and helped students internalize positive values. Students showed enthusiasm and thoughtful expression, making the observance meaningful and enriching.

Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti - Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Jayanti (Parakram Diwas) is observed on **23rd January** every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of **Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose**, a fearless freedom fighter and visionary leader of India’s independence movement. The day honors his bravery, patriotism, and inspirational leadership, motivating the youth through his ideals and his powerful call, *“Give me blood, and I shall give you freedom.”* To mark the occasion, students of **Grades VI–VIII** participated in a **slogan writing activity** portraying Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose as an inspiration for today’s youth. Students created original slogans reflecting his ideals of bravery, leadership, discipline, and patriotism, supported by **2–3 explanatory lines**. The activity encouraged creative expression and helped students connect Netaji’s vision and values with present-day India.

National Girl Child Day – National Girl Child Day is observed annually in India on **24th January** to raise awareness about the rights, education, health, and empowerment of girls. To commemorate the occasion, students of **Classes VI–VIII** participated in a class activity titled **“Government Schemes for the Girl Child”** on **22 January 2026**. Students researched and presented information on various government initiatives such as *Beti Bachao Beti Padhao* and *Sukanya Samridhi Yojana* through neatly prepared **A3 size sheets** with written content

and illustrations. The activity helped students understand social responsibility, gender equality, and the role of government in securing a better future for the girl child.

Republic Day- India celebrates **Republic Day on 26th January** to commemorate the adoption and enforcement of the Indian Constitution in **1950**, marking the nation's transformation into a **sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic** governed by its own laws, replacing the British-era Government of India Act. The day upholds the constitutional values of **justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity**, empowering citizens to choose their own government. Unlike **Independence Day (15th August)**, which marks freedom from British rule, Republic Day celebrates the establishment of India's constitutional democracy. To mark this occasion, **Grade 1 students presented a special assembly** that beautifully instilled feelings of **patriotism and national pride** through melodious songs, a meaningful skit, and vibrant dance performances. The assembly began with the **Principal's flag hoisting**, followed by the **National Anthem**, setting a solemn and inspiring tone for the celebration.

IHS students also celebrated **Basant Panchami** with great joy and enthusiasm through a special assembly. The assembly highlighted the importance of Basant Panchami as a festival that marks the arrival of spring and honours Goddess Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom. The children came dressed in yellow, symbolising energy, happiness, and learning. They sang a melodious song, and performed a dance about the festival with confidence. The assembly concluded with a message encouraging students to love learning and respect knowledge. The celebration was colourful, meaningful, and enjoyed by everyone present.

Revision for the Final Term Examination has started in all subjects. Teachers are helping the students to revise via quizzes, written tests and verbal responses, and it is the time for the students to showcase what they have retained till now. We hope they will come out with flying colors in the Final Term examination.

Value of the month: The value of the month was **respect**, and students were sensitized to its significance through meaningful discussions on respecting the armed forces, the ideals of Swami Vivekananda, and the invaluable contributions of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Through interactive discussions, activities, and real-life examples, students understood that respect goes beyond words—it involves empathy, kindness, and valuing the feelings and efforts of others. They were encouraged to demonstrate respect in their everyday interactions by being considerate, helpful, and appreciative, without expecting anything in return. By practicing respect towards peers, teachers, family members, and the wider community, students are guided to grow not only as confident learners but also as responsible, compassionate, and empathetic individuals.

National Road Safety Month (RSM)- National Road Safety Month (RSM) is an initiative of the **Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH), Government of India**, aimed at promoting road safety awareness across the country. To strengthen the Ministry's efforts, the **National Safety Council (NSC)** has been actively supporting and promoting the observance since **2011**. As part of this initiative, NSC develops and distributes awareness materials such as **banners, safety posters, pocket guides, and safety films**, enabling its members and patrons to observe National Road Safety Month effectively every year. In alignment with this national initiative, **students of Imperial Heritage School took a Road Safety Pledge on 22nd January**, reaffirming their commitment to follow traffic rules, promote safe road practices, and spread awareness about road safety within the community.

Subject Enrichment Activities: As a part of the subject enrichment in **English**, Speaking Skills were conducted in the first week of February. The students had to present a short speech on a given topic. The topics focussed on peer pressure, bullying, screen time consumption, and many more. The students were given a choice to present it individually or in pairs in under 2 minutes. The 3Cs : Content, Confidence, Clarity, were assessed for all. Many spoke very passionately whereas for others, it was an opportunity to think constructively on a topic and present it with confidence. The ASL in **French** was conducted to help students learn French vocabulary and communication skills. The topics covered were *Ma maison* and *Les repas français*.





