**Greetings from Imperial Heritage School!**

This month, our students enthusiastically participated in a range of enriching activities and competitions, gaining meaningful learning experiences while creating joyful memories.

The PTM was successfully conducted and parents were apprised of their ward’s academic progress through the unit test results. The students were also given the term end exams datesheet, signalling the onset of assessment and graduation to the next class.

**Educational outing to PVR, Elan Mall:** At IHS, learning goes beyond textbooks and classrooms. Our students enjoyed an exciting educational outing to PVR, Elan Mall, where they watched Avatar: Fire and Ash. The film offered a perfect blend of fun and meaningful learning, helping students reflect on themes like environmental conservation, courage, teamwork, and respect for nature. The stunning visuals and powerful storyline sparked curiosity and thoughtful conversations, making the experience both engaging and enriching. A joyful day filled with cinematic magic, learning, and unforgettable memories.

**National Youth Day – 16.01.26:** On National Youth Day, students created inspirational bookmarks featuring quotes by Swami Vivekananda. This activity encouraged students to reflect on his teachings about youth, strength, and character. It motivated them to imbibe positive values and strive for excellence in academics and life.

**National Girl Child Day – 22.01.26:** Students learned about various government schemes aimed at promoting and protecting the girl child. Through discussions and presentations, they gained awareness of education, health, and empowerment initiatives, fostering respect, equality, and a sense of responsibility towards supporting the growth and rights of girls.

**Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Jayanti – 23.01.26:** Students explored the life and contributions of Netaji Subash Chandra Bose, with special emphasis on his role in forming the Indian National Army. The activity inspired patriotism, courage, and leadership, helping students understand his sacrifices and unwavering dedication to India’s freedom struggle.

**National Road Safety Month (RSM)-** National Road Safety Month (RSM) is an initiative of the **Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH), Government of India**, aimed at promoting road safety awareness across the country. To strengthen the Ministry’s efforts, the **National Safety Council (NSC)** has been actively

supporting and promoting the observance since **2011**. As part of this initiative, NSC develops and distributes awareness materials such as **banners, safety posters, pocket guides, and safety films**, enabling its members and patrons to observe National Road Safety Month effectively every year. In alignment with this national initiative, **students of Imperial Heritage School took a Road Safety Pledge on 22 January**, reaffirming their commitment to follow traffic rules, promote safe road practices, and spread awareness about road safety within the community.

**Republic Day**- India celebrates **Republic Day on 26th January** to commemorate the adoption and enforcement of the Indian Constitution in **1950**, marking the nation's transformation into a **sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic** governed by its own laws, replacing the British-era Government of India Act. The day upholds the constitutional values of **justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity**, empowering citizens to choose their own government. Unlike **Independence Day (15th August)**, which marks freedom from British rule, Republic Day celebrates the establishment of India's constitutional democracy. To mark this occasion, **Grade 1 students presented a special assembly** that beautifully instilled feelings of **patriotism and national pride** through melodious songs, a meaningful skit, and vibrant dance performances. The assembly began with the **Principal's flag hoisting**, followed by the **National Anthem**, setting a solemn and inspiring tone for the celebration.

**IHS** students also celebrated **Basant Panchami** with great joy and enthusiasm through a special assembly. The assembly highlighted the importance of Basant Panchami as a festival that marks the arrival of spring and honours Goddess Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom. The children came dressed in yellow, symbolising energy, happiness, and learning. They sang a melodious song, and performed a dance about the festival with confidence. The assembly concluded with a message encouraging students to love learning and respect knowledge. The celebration was colourful, meaningful, and enjoyed by everyone present.

**Revision for the Final Term Examination** has started in all subjects. Teachers are helping the students to revise via quizzes, written tests and verbal responses, and it is the time for the students to showcase what they have retained till now. We hope they will come out with flying colors in the Final Term examination.

**Awards and Accolades:** Arshia Malik of Grade VIII B was awarded the **Merit of Distinction** in the SOF Olympiad for her outstanding performance, dedication, and academic excellence, making the school proud. Vaibhavi Lakhera of VIII A has won a silver medal at the 14th National Taekwondo Championship.

**Subject Enrichment Activity:** In **Science**, students enjoyed learning the principles of reflection of light by constructing a periscope, which helped them understand the concept through hands-on exploration and creative application. In **English**, as a part of the subject enrichment, Speaking Skills were conducted. The students had to present a short speech on a given topic. The topics focussed on peer pressure, bullying, screen time consumption, and many more. The students were given a choice to present it individually or in pairs in under 2 minutes. The 3Cs : Content, Confidence, Clarity, were assessed for all. Many spoke very passionately whereas for others, it was an opportunity to think constructively on a topic and present it with confidence.

**Star Performer:** Each month, students who consistently excel in academics, co-curricular activities, discipline, and overall participation are recognised with a Star Performer Certificate. This initiative not only celebrates their hard work and dedication but also encourages others to strive for excellence. The star performers for the month of September from Grade VIII A and VIII B are Aksh Bisla and Abhimanyu Rana respectively.

**Value of the month:** "Respect" was meaningfully reinforced through various classroom activities. During Swami Vivekananda Jayanti, students learned to respect self, knowledge, and discipline by reflecting on his teachings and life stories. **IHS News:**




