The program was attended by students from many countries, making the interaction lively, diverse, and enriching. Our Grade IX students **Jasmin Kaur, Samaira Khandelwal, Ashi Ojha and Archit Patel** actively interacted with students across the globe sharing about their lifestyle, school life and curriculum.

The PTM was successfully conducted and parents were apprised of their ward's academic progress through Unit Test III results. The students were also given the term end exams datesheet, signalling the onset of assessment and graduation to the next class.

To commemorate the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, **National Youth Day** is observed on **16th January**. Students of Grade IX presented a well-researched paper analysing the political relationship between Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and Adolf Hitler, critically examining diplomatic strategies within the historical context of World War II and Netaji's unwavering objective of India's independence. This activity enhanced historical understanding, critical thinking, creativity, and value-based learning while fostering respect for India's freedom struggle and inspiring responsible citizenship.

National Girl Child Day was observed in the school to create awareness about the importance of the girl child and promote gender equality among students. Students of Grade IX, wrote a **life sketch of female bureaucrats of India**, inspiring them through examples of leadership, determination, and service.

On Saturday, 17th January 2026, **Aditya Thanvi, Aditi, Kanishka Kalia, Harshika, Avisha Shukla and Jeevika Kaushik** attended a specialized talk on "Statistics: Learning from Data" by Prof. Neeraj Joshi (Department of Mathematics, IIT Delhi) at IIT Delhi. This session was highly beneficial for students looking to

pursue future careers in STEM.

Republic Day- India celebrates **Republic Day on 26th January** to commemorate the adoption and enforcement of the Indian Constitution in **1950**, marking the nation's transformation into a **sovereign, socialist, secular, and democratic republic** governed by its own laws, replacing the British-era Government of India Act. The day upholds the constitutional values of **justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity**, empowering citizens to choose their own government. Unlike **Independence Day (15th August)**, which marks freedom from British rule, Republic Day celebrates the establishment of India's constitutional democracy. To mark this occasion, **Grade 1 students presented a special assembly** that beautifully instilled feelings of **patriotism and national pride** through melodious songs, a meaningful skit, and vibrant dance performances. The assembly began with the **Principal's flag hoisting**, followed by the **National Anthem**, setting a solemn and inspiring tone for the celebration.

IHS students also celebrated **Basant Panchami** with great joy and enthusiasm through a special assembly. The assembly highlighted the importance of Basant Panchami as a festival that marks the arrival of spring and honours Goddess Saraswati, the goddess of knowledge and wisdom.
