Greetings!**

The **New Year** ushered in fresh beginnings and opened an exciting new chapter for all of us. After the holiday break, the school once again came alive with the joyful chatter and laughter of students. Our little munchkins returned refreshed after a fun-filled vacation, filled with enthusiasm and curiosity as they stepped into the new term. January brought with it a pleasant winter chill and a sense of new possibilities—a blank canvas waiting to be painted with joyful experiences. The month was packed with delightful activities such as White Colour Day, Republic Day celebrations, and the Show and Tell Intra-Class Competition on Community Helpers, giving our young learners wonderful opportunities to explore, learn, and express themselves with confidence and joy..

Students actively participated in their learning journey, showing great curiosity and enthusiasm. In **Literacy**, a recap of previously learned CVC words was conducted to strengthen reading and blending skills. Students were also introduced to digraph words ch, sh, th, and wh helping them identify and read new words with ease. Through a variety of engaging and hands-on activities, learners practiced sound recognition and word formation. These activities encouraged active participation, improved pronunciation, enhanced vocabulary, and boosted confidence. Overall, the learning sessions were interactive, meaningful, and enjoyable, fostering a positive attitude toward language learning.

In **Numeracy**, students explored addition through a variety of fun and interactive activities. They practiced adding quantities using pictures, which made learning both visual and enjoyable, and strengthened their skills with single-digit addition. Students also worked on ascending and descending order, learning to arrange numbers correctly and connect them with their numerals. In addition, they revised all the mathematical concepts learned so far, reinforcing their understanding and building confidence. These hands-on exercises made math engaging while providing a strong foundation for future learning.

In the EVS theme of **Community Helpers**, students learned about different helpers by connecting the concepts to their everyday lives, helping them understand the important role these individuals play in the community. The **Community Helper Intra Class Competition** gave the children a wonderful opportunity to showcase their creativity and knowledge, as they enthusiastically presented various professions. From little police officers to tiny doctors, the event not only highlighted their talents but also encouraged respect and appreciation for the valuable work done by community helpers. As part of the **Community Helpers** theme, students created **Chef Spoon Holder Crafts** using **paper cups**. They painted the cups **brown and white** and decorated them with **buttons and googly eyes** to make cheerful little chefs. After completing their crafts, the students **used them to hold spoons**, combining creativity with a practical purpose. This hands-on activity encouraged **imagination, fine motor skills, and understanding the role of chefs** as important community helpers in a fun and engaging way.

On **White Colour Day**, students had a fun-filled and creative celebration exploring the color white. They made adorable white caterpillar crafts using white sheets. After assembling the caterpillars, they added googly eyes, antennas, and pasted cheerful faces, then made their caterpillars move using kulfi sticks. The activities encouraged hands-on creativity while teaching the children about colors in a fun and interactive way. Their excitement and enthusiasm made White Day a truly memorable experience!

On account of **Republic Day**, students engaged in a creative activity by making a **Tri-Colour Lotus Craft**. They carefully **pasted leaves in a 3D format** to form a beautiful lotus, exploring texture, color, and design. This hands-on activity not only encouraged **creativity and fine motor skills** but also helped children understand the significance of the **tricolour** and the spirit of our nation in a fun and engaging way. Their vibrant creations reflected their enthusiasm and made the celebration memorable.

Bagless Day – A Day of Fun, Creativity & Meaningful Learning

Bagless Day was thoughtfully organized to recapitulate letters, numbers, and shapes through engaging and hands-on activities. The students showcased their creativity by colouring their names on clay bases and painting attractive name plates, reinforcing both literacy and artistic expression. They also enthusiastically participated in tearing and pasting activities using different shape outlines, happily getting their little hands busy with paint and glue. They enjoyed learning addition in a fun and interactive way using the “addition machine” with manipulatives, making the day both educational and memorable.

The **value of the month**, Respect, was taught through a variety of engaging and age-appropriate activities and role play. Teachers introduced the concept through **story narration**, followed by simple discussions that helped children understand how to show respect in their daily lives. IHS News –


