On the occasion of **World English Day**, the teacher explained the significance of the day and why it is celebrated globally. The session began with an insightful discussion where students learned about the importance of the English language in connecting people worldwide. Following the interactive session, students participated in a unique listening activity. During the activity, the teacher pronounced different words, and students were asked to draw pictures representing those words on A4 sheets. This activity not only enhanced their listening skills but also sparked creativity and helped reinforce vocabulary through visual expression.

The **EVS** activity turned into an exciting school tour where students explored key areas such as the library, infirmary, music room, and playground. This guided tour helped them become familiar with their school environment and understand the function of various spaces around them. In **Mathematics**, students dove into the concepts of Tens and Ones using colorful manipulatives and an Abacus model to build and break numbers. They also explored the concept of Time in the Math by creating their own paper clocks—visually and practically learning how minutes and hours work. These real-life connections and practical applications helped deepen their understanding while making abstract concepts more relatable. The hands-on approach not only enhanced comprehension but also brought joy and excitement to every classroom session. In **Hindi**, students learned words with the “अ” vowel in a fun and creative way by using A4 sheets to draw vibrant pictures linked to different colors. They created clouds using black (काला), grass and spinach with green (हरा), and tomatoes and pomegranates with

red (लाल). Through this engaging activity, the children not only recognized words containing the “अ” vowel but also practiced writing the names of colors in Hindi.
