As part of our **Political Science curriculum**, students of Class X prepared and presented PowerPoint presentations on the topic Power Sharing. In Biology, students practically explored the structural features of stomata by preparing temporary slides. Through microscopic observation, they identified the guard cells and stomatal pores, enhancing their understanding of stomatal structure. This activity also helped them recapitulate the vital functions of stomata in the processes of transpiration and gaseous exchange, as part of the chapter *Life Processes*.

Through this exercise, students explored the concept of Recommended Daily Allowance (RDA) for sugar and critically examined nutritional labels on packaged food items. On May 26th, students from Grades IX to XII enjoyed an exhilarating **outing to Ambience Mall**, where they watched *Mission Impossible*. The thrilling cinematic experience was thoroughly enjoyed by all, making it a memorable day for the students.

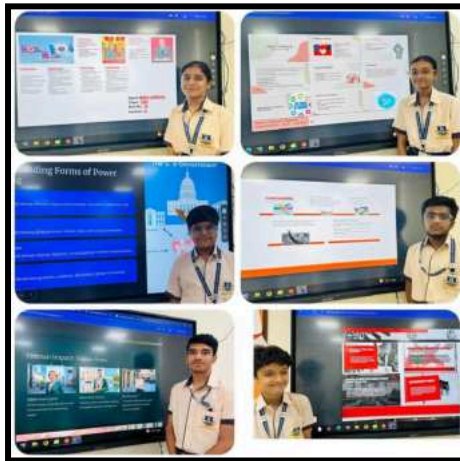
