Earth Day was observed with a thoughtful class discussion highlighting the importance of our planet. Students took a meaningful pledge to protect the Earth and proudly wrote it down in class. As part of the 'Each One Plant One' activity, every child planted a sapling, learning the importance of greenery. They also created

eco-friendly gift wraps using old newspapers. One of the most exciting moments was the **Intra-Class Eco-Friendly Fashion Show**, where students wore outfits made of sustainable materials and confidently shared a few lines about their attire.

World English Day Celebration- To celebrate World English Day, students took part in a fun **Word Scavenger Hunt**. They searched for hidden word cards around the class, read each word aloud, and identified it as a **common** or **proper noun**. The activity made learning grammar exciting and enjoyable for all!

World Dance Day- On April 29th, World Dance Day was celebrated with great energy. Students expressed themselves through freestyle dance and thoroughly enjoyed the rhythm and movement.

Mother's Day Activity

Academic Highlights

In **English**, students revisited previously learned topics and explored new grammar concepts like nouns. They especially enjoyed the interactive game of *Name*, *Place*, *Animal*, *and Thing*, reinforcing their grammar skills while having fun. They also dived into interesting literature Chapter 1- Caterpillar that sparked their imagination. Students enjoyed a nature walk, rhymes, and role play while exploring the poem *The Caterpillar*. They learned about metamorphosis through a creative craft and brought the life cycle to life with a joyful performance.

In **Math**, students began by revisiting previous concepts and then explored *Place Value* through a creative craft activity. As part of the *Math Lab – Place Value Activity*, they joined blocks to form groups of tens, which helped them visualize how numbers grow and sparked engaging discussions about building numbers up to 100 and beyond. The chapter on *Addition* was also introduced, where students created a vibrant *Number Bond* craft in their notebooks, helping them understand how numbers come together to form a sum. These interactive sessions made math both meaningful and enjoyable.

In **EVS**, students learned about the topic *My Family* and created beautiful Family Trees by pasting or drawing pictures of their family members, helping them relate classroom learning to real life. They also explored the chapters *Our Neighbourhood* and *My Body*, learning about community helpers, places around us, and the importance of taking care of our bodies. These lessons helped students develop a better understanding of themselves and their environment.

Value of the Month – Responsibility

The value for the month was **Responsibility**. Students made a *Responsibility Circle* group craft, where they wrote different ways they demonstrate responsibility at school, home, and in their community.

Assemblies that Inspire – Led by Grade II A and II B.
