We are proud to announce a stellar performance in the CBSE Board Examinations, with 100% pass percentage in both Grade X and XII. Our students have excelled across subjects, with many securing distinctions. The value of the month was **RESPONSIBILITY** for living things which was discussed through discussions and role plays and activities. Students learnt how to be responsible at school, home and to mother earth. Moreover, moral values were also inculcated during the regular teaching-learning process.

As part of our health and wellness awareness initiative under the CBSE curriculum, our school organized an informative and engaging activity titled 'Sugar Board'. The primary aim was to educate students about the rising cases of diabetes in children, which is often linked to high sugar consumption and poor dietary habits. During the activity, a colorful and eye-catching Sugar Awareness Board was created and displayed prominently in the school corridor. This board illustrated the hidden sugar content in various commonly consumed food items such as soft drinks, packaged snacks, chocolates, pastries, and fast food. The students were actively engaged in a discussion session, where they learned to distinguish between healthy and junk food. Through visual aids and real-life examples, they were shown how excess sugar affects the body, leading to long-term health problems including early-onset diabetes. To encourage better eating habits, students were also introduced to healthy alternatives to their favorite junk foods.

Children took part in many hands-on activities to understand different topics better. In English, while learning about the chapter 'Sentences', they did a fun activity where they cut out pictures from old newspapers and magazines and wrote their own sentences based on the pictures. This helped them learn how to write complete and meaningful sentences. For the chapter 'Questions', students made their own questions and interviewed their mothers, which taught them how to ask questions correctly. They also did an activity on Subject and Predicate, where they found sentences in the newspaper and marked the subject and predicate in two different colours. These creative tasks made learning fun and helped students understand how to make different types of sentences.

In **E.V.S**, students made a Collage of memories and Family Genogram related to the chapter – My Family. Through this activity, they were sensitised about big, joint and nuclear families. They were also explained the importance of showing love and care towards their elders. In addition to this, they did an activity related to the Chapter-We Care in which Students did a role play on people with disabilities and gained a deeper understanding of the lives of disabled people, in another activity they explored the sensory station where they learned about their senses and how they explored them with the things that they found in their houses and in their neighbourhood. Related to the chapter-Games We Play, students creatively made their favourite indoor and outdoor games on paper and discussed the same with their peers. Our students even got creative and invented their own game with their own rules and they also explored the games all over the world and presented them in the class. These games not only brought them immense fun but also connected them to the simpler, joyous times.

In **Mathematics** students were introduced to the concept of Large Numbers in which they did an activity called Fiddle,Faddle and Flop where they made their own numbers and their friends tried to guess that number from the hints given to them. In another activity named Number Hunt they were given flashcards with some questions and answers and they were asked to hunt for the answers that were written in their card.

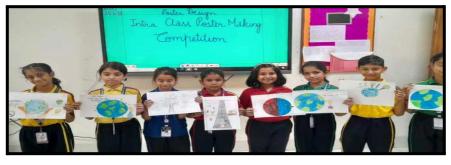
