An acting activity in **Hindi** class based on the lesson Aangan ke Vriksh was conducted for the students of Grade V. 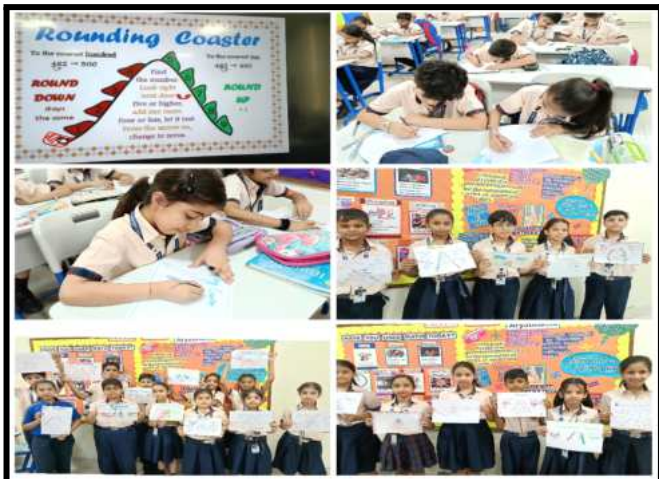
