Dear Parents,

The academic session 2025 - 26 started on a very positive note as the students thronged back to school, excited to meet their friends and teachers. To pay homage to the victims of the **Jallianwala Bagh Massacre**, which occurred on April 13, 1919, in Amritsar, Students prepared heartfelt presentations remembering the tragic event and honoring the sacrifices made during India's struggle for independence.

An assembly was conducted on **Environment Day** by Grade X students to embrace the spirit of preserving Mother Nature. The assembly started with the morning prayer followed by a song on the environment, dance performances and some fun games by the students to raise awareness about some of our most pressing environmental problems.

To mark **World English Day**, a thought-provoking **debate** was organised for Grades IX and XI in collaboration with **The Times of India - Newspaper in Education (NIE) on 23rd April, 2025**. The topic of the debate was **"Should English Remain the Global Language?"**, sparking engaging arguments from both sides. Participants showcased excellent oratory skills, critical thinking, and well-researched perspectives. The event not only honed students' public speaking abilities but also deepened their understanding of language's role in shaping global communication. The event, known for its high standards of debate and diplomatic engagement, provided an invaluable platform for students to showcase and enhance their public speaking, critical thinking, and collaborative skills.

Leaders house won the tournament and Challengers secured the runner-up position.

## A.I.

Computer lab was turned into an innovation hub as students explored Artificial Intelligence through engaging in AI-based games like Quick Draw, Scavenger Hunt, Stone-Paper-Scissor. From strategy challenges to creative problem-solving games, students discovered how AI thinks, learns, and adapts all while having fun.

## Biology

In Biology class, Grade IX students explored the structural differences between plant and animal cells through hands-on activities. They prepared temporary mounts of onion peel and cheek cells to observe under the microscope. This practical activity reinforced their understanding of cell structure and the fundamental differences between plant and animal cells.

## Chemistry

In chemistry lab students were given the demonstration of determination of boiling point of water and the process of sublimation - deposition of Ammonium Chloride.

## Physics

In Physics lab, students of Grade IX performed an experiment to determine the density of a solid object whose density was greater than water. It helped the students to understand the concept in a practical way.

The value of the month was **Responsibility**. Throughout the month, students were encouraged to reflect on their actions, fulfill their duties sincerely, and be accountable for their choices. Whether it was completing homework on time, helping at home, or taking care of the environment, students actively practised responsibility in everyday life.

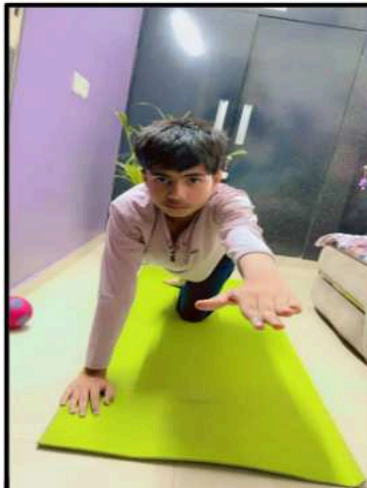
